

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade. Wheat for September delivery fell 3.75 cents to \$4.9325 a bushel; September corn was off 1.75 cents to 3.6350 a bushel; December oats were 2.75 cents lower to 2.65 a bushel; while November soybeans were up 2.50 cents to \$9.4225 a bushel. Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle was off 1.30 cents to \$1.4935 a pound; August feeder cattle fell 2.80 cents to \$2.2192 a pound; while August lean hogs were .37 cent lower at \$.76 a pound.

Bloomfield Is Celebrating 125 Years

BLOOMFIELD, Neb. — The town of Bloomfield, Nebraska is celebrating 125 years of history this weekend with four days worth of activities for the whole family. The theme is "Celebrating Home-town Heroes." Because of this, the festivities will feature a "Cost of Freedom" tribute. This includes a replica of the American Veterans Traveling Tribute Vietnam Memorial Wall, which provides those without the means or ability to travel to our great national memorial sites, the opportunity to respect and share in the experience of honoring our heroes. Events will encompass the entire area, with everything from craft shows to live entertainment. These activities will be hosted throughout the town, most of them taking place at the fairgrounds, the location of the famous Know County Fair. Bloomfield was founded at a huge "sale-of-lots auction" on Oct. 2, 1890. The Bloomfield Monitor, also arriving at the birth of the community, reported that between 400-500 men gathered to take part in the beginning of the town. The town was "rightly named" because of the goldenrod blooming in the fields at that time of the year. The area is well chosen, not only for its geographically strategic location, but also for its natural beauty and resources. Its central location placed Bloomfield in a 40-year dispute over the location of the county seat with the towns of Niobrara, Creighton and Verdigre. Bloomfield also became the site of the Know County Fair in 1918. As a result, the fair was named the third largest fair in Nebraska in 1940 and still is considered so today. Bloomfield hosted its centennial in 1990 and hosts "Bloomfield Appreciation Dayz" every June. This year being the 125th anniversary of the town, locals decided to combine events into a four-day celebration, which began Thursday. WALL ST. RECAP

U.S. stocks closed higher on Thursday, propelling the Nasdaq composite index to an all-time high. It was the best day for stocks in a week and came a day after the Federal Reserve said that it needed to see more improvement in the economy before raising its benchmark interest rate.

FOR THE DAY:

The Dow Jones industrial average rose 180.10 points, or 1 percent, to 18,115.84. The Standard & Poor's 500 index gained 20.80 points, or 1 percent, to 2,121.24. The Nasdaq added 68.07 points, or 1.3 percent, to 5,132.95.

The Dow is up 217 points, or 1.2 percent. The S&P 500 index is up 27.13 points, or 1.3 percent. The Nasdaq is up 81.85 points, or 1.6 percent.
