Bloomfield was founded at a huge "sale-of-lots auction" on Oct. 2, 1890. The Bloomfield Monitor, also arriving at the birth of the community, reported that between 400-500 men gathered to take part in the beginning of the town.

The town was "rightly named" because of the goldenrod blooming in the fields at that time of the year. The area is well chosen, not only for its geographically strategic location, but also for its natural beauty and resources. Its central location placed Bloomfield in a 40-year dispute over the location of the Creighton and Verdigre.

Bloomfield also became the site of the Know County Fair in 1918. As a result, the fair was named the third largest fair in Nebraska in 1940 and still is considered so today.

Bloomfield hosted its centennial in 1990 and hosts "Bloomfield Appreciation Dayz" every June. This year being the 125th anniversary of the town, locals decided to combine events into a, four-day celebration, which began Thursday.

Funds To Be Distributed To Local Governments

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Transportation will be distributing \$12.5 million in state highway funds to local governments by the end of June. The funds will go to counties and cities with populations above 5,000, also known as Class 1 cities.

'This past legislative session, Gov. Daugaard not only led the effort to increase funding for state highways, but to lessen the restrictions on how local governments use highway funds," Transporta-tion Secretary Darin Bergquist

In previous years, the federal Surface Transportation Program (STP) funds that were allocated to each of the counties and Class 1


cities had many restrictions and could only be used on federal-aid eligible projects let to bid through the DOT. These restrictions resulted in several counties and cities accumulating their allocations for years until they were able to use the

money on allowable projects. The annual allocation is now being given to the local governments in the form of state highway funds that can be used on any road or bridge repair or maintenance.

Starting in September, the department will begin issuing checks to replace the accumulated STP balances with state highway funds.
