

State Grants Advance Public University Research

PIERRE — Eight faculty members from public universities are the latest to receive competitive state research grants through the South Dakota Board of Regents.

"These competitive grants direct additional resources to university researchers to acquire the equipment and graduate research staff necessary to further their research projects," said Nathan Lukkes, the regents' vice president of research and economic development. "These projects support undergraduate and graduate students, as well as strengthen the universities, and ultimately the state, by generating commercial activ-

A total of 30 grant proposals were submitted; eight were funded for a total of \$450,513. For the third year, more faculty members were given an opportunity to compete for funding by splitting the grants into two award

All but two of the eight research projects are newly funded. Second-vear funding was received for research by the University of South Dakotas Meghann Jarchow and South Dakota State University's Reinaldo Tonkoski.


