 Wheat for September delivery rose 13.5 cents to \$5.06 a bushel; September corn was up 5.5 cents to 3.6425 a bushel; December oats were 5.25 cents higher at 2.6350 a bushel; while November soybeans surged 19.5 cents to \$9.5925 a bushel.
