NSAA Director Resigns

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — The executive director of the Nebraska School Activities Association has resigned a month after the association's board of directors voted not to extend her contract.
Rhonda Blanford-Green, a former All-America track athlete at Nebraska, took over as executive director in July 2012. She'd spent 16 years as an administrator with the Colorado High School Athletic Association.
She said Monday that her decision to resign "is in the best interests of the association."
In May the board decided not to lengthen her contract beyond June 2016. Board chairman Brian Maher, who voted to extend the contract, cited personnel privacy in declining to say why the board's majority voted against the extension. A year ago the board voted unanimously to extend Blanford-Green's contract for a year.

Iowa State Releases Non-Conf.

AMES, Iowa (AP) — Iowa State will face the likes of Colorado, Cincinnati, Virginia Tech and Texas A&M as part of a non-conference schedule next season.
The Cyclones will host Chicago State and Chattanooga after opening against the Buffaloes in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.
Iowa State will play the Hokies and then either Illinois or UAB — which stunned the Cyclones in last year's NCAA Tournament — in the Emerald Coast Classic in Florida.
Iowa State hosts rivals Iowa at home and Northern Iowa in Des Moines. North Dakota State, Buffalo, Arkansas-Pine Bluff and Coppin State round out its non-conference home schedule.
The Cyclones will interrupt their round-robin Big 12 slate by playing at Texas A&M on Jan. 30. The schedule was released Tuesday.

NDSU's Teschuk To Compete For

FARGO, N.D. (AP) — North Dakota State University junior track and field athlete Erin Teschuk will compete for Canada in the 2015 Pan American Games.
Athletics Canada and the Canadian Olympic Committee selected Teschuk to compete in the 3,000-meter steeplechase.
The Pan Am Games involve the 41 countries of North America, South America, Central America and the Caribbean and are held every four years in the year before the Summer Olympics. This year's games are July 10-26 in Toronto.
Teschuk's race is July 24.
Teschuk is from Winnipeg, Manitoba. She became the first woman in NDSU history to qualify for the NCAA Championships in cross country, indoor track and outdoor track at the Division I level. Her three first-team All-America citations are the most ever by a Bison.

Iowa Expecting Dip In Football

SEASON TICKET SALES
IOWA CITY, Iowa (AP) — Iowa expects its number of season tickets sold to drop by as many as 4,000 this fall.
The Hawkeyes finished 2014 with just under 40,000 season ticket holders. Athletic director Gary Barta says the Hawkeyes anticipate selling between 35,000 to 37,000 of those to the general public by next season.
Iowa's overall ticket sales have plunged in the past few years, and a blowout bowl loss to Tennessee in January following a 7-5 regular season didn't help.
Next season's home schedule is tepid, highlighted by Pitt, Minnesota, Purdue and Illinois.
But the Hawkeyes finished 22nd nationally in 2014 with nearly 68,000 fans per game, and Barta says they believe an increase on that average is "attainable."

Ohio Lawmakers Hold Off On

MEASURE SUPPORTING PETE ROSE
COLUMBUS, Ohio (AP) — Ohio lawmakers are delaying any action on a resolution urging baseball's commissioner to reinstate all-time hits leader Pete Rose and make the former Cincinnati Reds star eligible for the Hall of Fame.
The measure was pulled from a legislative committee's agenda for Tuesday, a day after ESPN reported it obtained a

notebook that shows Rose bet on Reds games during his last season as an active player in 1986.
The House speaker's spokeswoman says the proposal's sponsors and the committee chairman decided to put the issue on hold and possibly re-evaluate it later, once more information is available.
Rose agreed to a lifetime ban in 1989 after an investigation for Major League Baseball concluded he bet on games while he was a player and manager.
He has applied for reinstatement.

Syracuse Ironman Event Hands

OUT MEDALS FEATURING WRONG CITY
SYRACUSE, N.Y. (AP) — The medals awarded to winners in last weekend's Ironman event in Syracuse are engraved with an outline of the Rochester skyline.
The Post-Standard of Syracuse reports that the medal's for Sunday's Ironman 70.3 Syracuse feature a scene that depicts an arched suspension bridge over the Genesee River, which runs through downtown Rochester. And the skyscrapers on the medal match those in Rochester.
A spokesman for the Ironman didn't have an immediate explanation for the error Monday.
The race started with a 1.2-mile swim in Jamesville Reservoir, then a 56-mile bike course that wound through Syracuse's Highland Forest and parts of Onondaga, Madison and Cortland counties. The event ended with 13.1-mile run in and out of Jamesville Beach County Park.
Rochester is 75 miles west of Syracuse.

Brady Appeal Hearing Ends After

MORE THAN 10 HOURS
NEW YORK (AP) — After a 10-hour hearing, Tom Brady now must wait to find out if his appeal of a four-game suspension carried any weight with NFL Commissioner Roger Goodell.
Brady was suspended by the league for his role in the use of deflated footballs in the AFC championship game win over Indianapolis. He arrived at the NFL's Park Avenue offices Tuesday morning, as did attorney Jeffrey Kessler, who is leading Brady's defense.
It was growing dark when Goodell left the league headquarters after he heard Brady and representatives from the players' union during the lengthy meeting. League security said Brady also had left.
No details of the hearing were immediately available.

The United States has won the World Cup twice, but the team's last title came in 1999. The second-ranked Americans are among the favorites in Canada, along with top-ranked Germany and third-ranked France.
The U.S. will play No. 16 China on Friday night in Ottawa. The winner of that game will go on to face the winner of the Friday quarter-final between Germany and France in Montreal.
Abby Wambach, who missed a penalty kick in the match against Colombia, was asked after the match whether the yellow cards for Rapinoe and Holiday were deserved.
"I don't know," Wambach said. "That's definitely a great question. I don't know if they were yellows. It seemed like she (the referee) was purposefully giving those yellows to maybe players that she knew were sitting on yellows. I don't know if that was just a psychological thing, who knows. Who knows, Wambach said."
Those comments concerning French referee Stephanie Frappart could merit discipline by FIFA, soccer's international governing body. Canadian striker Christine Sinclair made comments

which had pulled off one of the biggest upsets of World Cup with victory over France in the group stage.
Wambach missed a penalty kick early in the second half after Colombia goalkeeper Catalina Perez was ejected from the match for a foul on Morgan.
