Week 5 of the summer reading program at the Yankton Community Library, 515 Walnut, is a short but busy one. "Patriotic Heroes" is our theme.

Teen movies begin at 11:30 a.m. Monday, June 29. At 3 p.m., there are crafts for elementary students. The project for the day is fireworks paintings. Preschool story time is at 6:30 p.m. Books, songs and activities will celebrate the Fourth of July. There is a Teen Advisory Board (TAB) meeting at 7 p.m. to discuss upcoming summer activities and begin planning for fall. New TAB members are always welcome. Students in grades 6-12 are invited to join.

On Tuesday, June 30, Toddler Time with stories, songs and movement is at 10:15 a.m. and a repeat session at 5:30 p.m. This is for ages 1-3 with a parent or caregiver, but siblings are welcome. It is not too late to register for the summer reading program as it runs through July. "Every Hero Has a Story" is for preschoolers and elementary students; "Unmask" is the teen program for students in grades 6-12. Register at the library, pick up your program materials, and join the fun.

BOARD OF TRADE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were higher Thursday on the Chicago Board of Trade.
Wheat for September delivery gained 14.75 cents to \$5.38 a bushel; September corn was 11.25 cents higher at 3.8275 a bushel; December oats were 1.75 cents higher at 2.7075 a bushel; while November soybeans advanced 21.75 cents to \$9.7775 a bushel.
Beef and pork were lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange. August live cattle was off 1.75 cents to \$14.857 a pound; August feeder cattle fell 4.5 cents to \$2.1905 a pound; while August lean hogs fell .20 cent to \$7.215 a pound.

WALL ST. RECAP

Stocks edged lower Thursday as hopes for a Greek debt solution faded and talks between the country and its creditors got extended into the weekend. Health care stocks rose sharply after the Supreme Court upheld the Affordable Care Act's insurance subsidies.
