S.D. Plant Proposes Byproducts Plant

HURON (AP) — The Dakota Provisions turkey processing plant at Huron wants to build a second plant that would make pet food out of the byproducts from the processing plant.

Jeff Sveen, chairman of the Dakota Provisions board, said waste products that include feathers and blood are now trucked to a plant in Worthington, Minn.

He said the plant would employ 15 people initially and as many as 40 eventually.

The turkey plant is owned by a consortium of Hutterite colonies and has 675 employees.

Greater Huron Development Corporation and Dakota Gobblers LLC have applied for a variance to build the plant where it is not a permitted use in a general industrial district. GHDC is involved because it would acquire the 8 acres of city-owned land that would be part of the transaction.

The 10,000-square-foot plant would be built about three-fourths of a mile from the processing plant and surrounded on three sides by city lagoons.

Property owners living nearby said at a hearing on the variance request that worry about odors and a potential negative impact that further discharges into the lagoons could have an air quality.

Much of the odor that people associate with byproducts plants is from dead animals, Sveen said. The proposed plant would process only fresh products, he said.

A hearing examiner ruled in favor of the variance request, sending it to the city commission.

Progress Made In Colleges' Dispute

NEBRASKA CITY, Neb. (AP) — Sen. Greg Adams of York says progress is being made to resolve a funding dispute among Nebraska's six community colleges.

Adams, chairman of the Legislature's Education Committee, attended a weekend summit in Nebraska City with representatives of the colleges and the Nebraska Community College Association.

After the summit concluded Sunday, Adams said there's still work to be done, but he's confident there will be a legislative solution in the future.

Details of the group's discussions were not released. Messages for Adams' aides were not immediately returned.

Metropolitan Community College, which has seven campuses in the Omaha area, has been squabbling with the state's five other community colleges over funding for decades. It was kicked out of the state's community college association last year for not paying its full dues.

Metro officials said a portion was withheld to protest what they believed was unfair treatment by other districts in the association.

Metro has since sued the other community colleges, claiming it lost about \$11 million in state funds because of miscalculations by the state and misrepresentations by the other schools. A trial is set to begin March 15.

The other community colleges in Nebraska are Central (Columbus), Mid-Plains (North Platte), Northeast (Norfolk), Southeast (Lincoln) and Western Nebraska (Scottsbluff).

Parolees' Pay To Leave South Dakota

SIJUX FALLS (AP) — South Dakotans who are on probation or parole and want to move to another state will be required to pay a \$50 application fee for the necessary paperwork.

The fee is an attempt to discourage parolees and probationers from asking Department of Corrections employees to complete the paperwork necessary for a move unless they are serious about following through.

Trial Court Services Director Nancy Aallard says the process is labor intensive.

She says 215 to 240 people on parole or probation move out of the state each year, and the \$11,000 to \$12,000 collected through the fees would be used to help pay for South Dakota's electronic case-filing system.

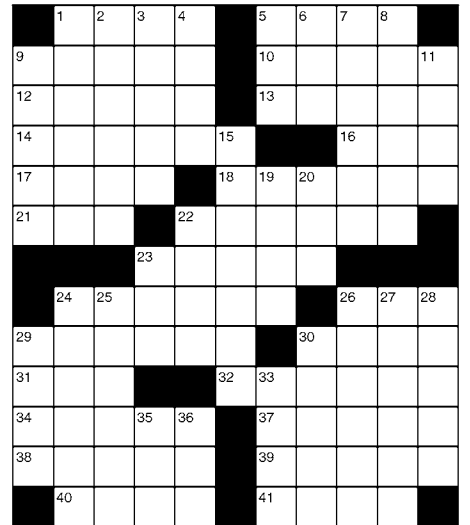

The activists have protested rising federal spending and what they see as the expansion of government into private enterprise.

The 25-year-old Mason is a Navy veteran. He says he believes in a laissez faire capitalism. Mason faces incumbent Lloyd LaCroix for the Ward 4 seat in the June 8 primary.
