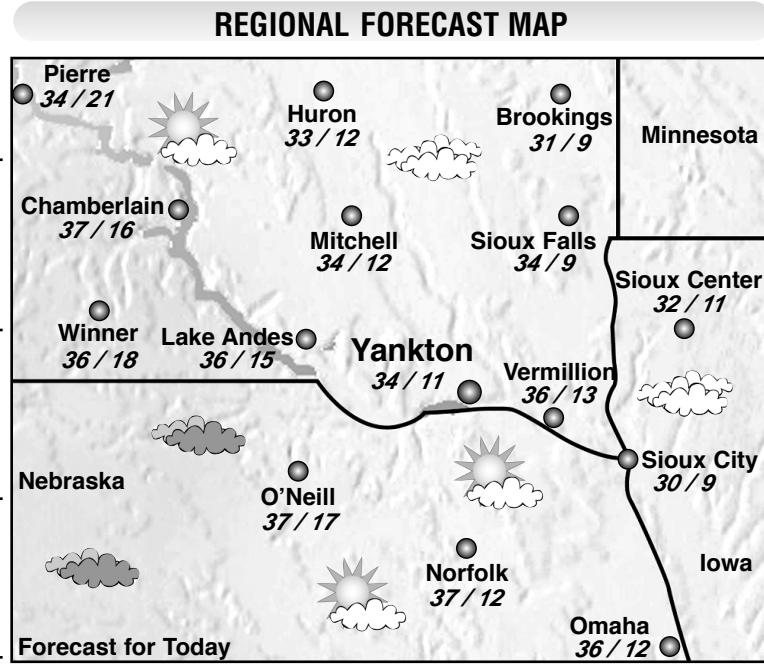

## ON THIS DATE

### 75 YEARS AGO

**Saturday, March 2, 1935**  
 • More than 500 tests on New Deal legislation were reported today to be pending in the federal courts of the country. More than half of them are said to involve the National Recovery Act and what exactly constitutes interstate commerce.  
 • After 54 days of bickering the South Dakota Legislature has finally succeeded in getting a liquor control measure approved by one house. The bill, which provides for a combination state and local control plan, withstood several assaults from the Senate floor.

### 50 YEARS AGO

**Wednesday, March 2, 1960**  
 • An explosion wrecked a residence in Vermillion Tuesday night, hospitalizing three persons. Three hours later fire broke out in the house next door and an elderly man living there also was hospitalized. The explosion, the third in South Dakota in successive days, blew out the back and side wall of the Donald Frasch house and also lifted off the roof.  
 • March did come in like a lion Tuesday, but the way the weather acted up during February, the lion wasn't overly ferocious. As was the case for 15 of the past 20 days, the mercury dropped below zero last night with a low reading of -4.

### 25 YEARS AGO

**Saturday, March 2, 1985**  
 • South Dakota state officials are not unsympathetic to the ongoing battle between state full-time equivalent employees and trustees at the South Dakota Human Services Center, said the executive director of the state Board of Charities and Corrections.  
 • State Democratic lawmakers' plans for starting a letter-writing campaign designed to explain farm problems to urban members of Congress is an outstanding idea, Gov. William Janklow said Friday.  
 • The Yankton Bucks warmed up for next week's sectional tournament play and captured third place in the ESD last night when they downed a scrappy Huron Tiger five 62-55 in the regular season last game for both teams.
