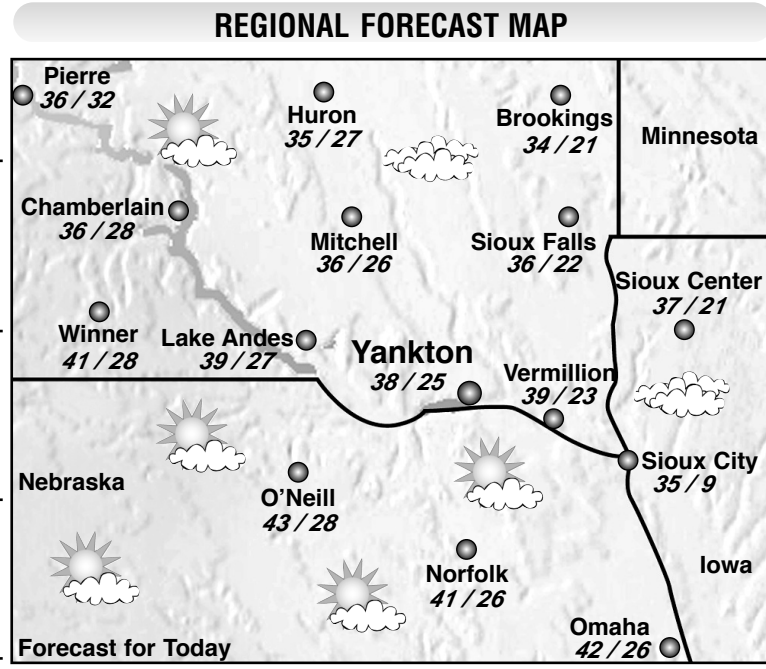

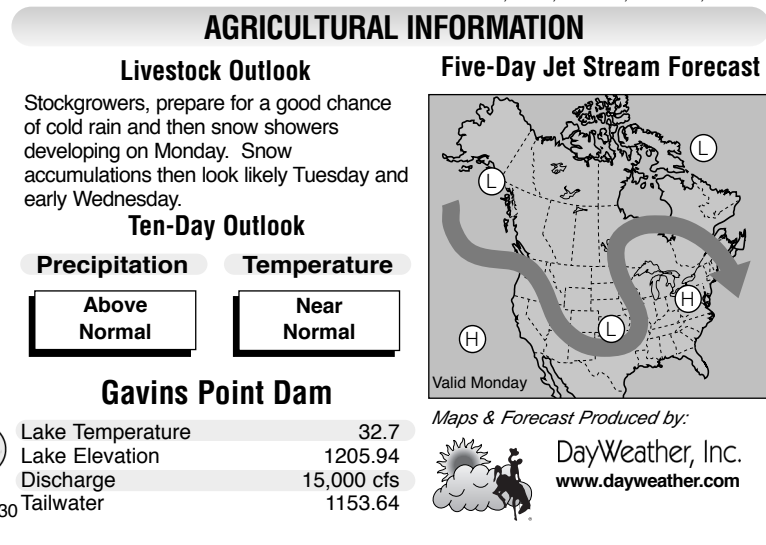
Stockgrowers, prepare for a good chance of cold rain and then snow showers developing on Monday. Snow accumulations then look likely Tuesday and early Wednesday.

ON THIS DATE

75 YEARS AGO

Monday, March 4, 1935

- The South Dakota House, by a 56 to 44 vote this morning passed a bill making it mandatory for the South Dakota highway commission to apportion 60 percent of its revenue among the counties on the basis of assessed valuation.
- Eight revenue sources for state and county relief were recommended to the South Dakota Legislature today in a resolution adopted at a meeting of county commissioners. The taxes included an additional gas tax, a chain store tax and taxes on electricity and natural gas.

50 YEARS AGO

Friday, March 4, 1960

- The Internal Revenue Service said today errant taxpayers who make anonymous contributions to the agency's "conscience fund" will be credited with the payments if tax agents ever catch up to them.
- President Eisenhower, admittedly "bushed" from 12 days of touring, may immediately give a preliminary report on his goodwill mission to four South American nations.
- Lucille Ball and Desi Arnaz, TV's most popular married couple, are in the divorce courts today. The red-haired comedienne sued her Cuban tycoon Thursday - her charge being the usual Hollywood complaint: "mental cruelty."

25 YEARS AGO

Monday, March 4, 1985

- Schools, businesses and government offices were shut down across the state as a third day of heavy snowfall blanketed the area. By today, the storm had dumped 10 to 17 inches of snow across the southern part of the state.
- Partisan political heat was turned up on the final day of the 1985 South Dakota Legislature as Democrats made last-ditch attempts to block Republican bills. Republican leaders said the session had been a success, while Democrats said South Dakotans will suffer from GOP-sponsored legislation.

to a filibuster had been used numerous times in recent years, including on passage of welfare reform legislation in the 1990s and twice when President George W. Bush pushed tax cuts to passage. Health care "deserves the same kind of up or down vote" as those earlier measures, he said.

on other priority legislation. At the same time, a defeat could damage Obama's ability to help fellow Democrats heading into the fall campaign. Failure on health care could well lead to a shake-up of the president's White House team, which has received criticism recently from Democratic lawmakers.

After nearly a year of struggle, the House and Senate passed separate bills late last year, and appeared on course for approving a final compromise version early in 2010. But those efforts were abruptly abandoned when Republicans unexpectedly won a special election in Massachusetts. Sen. Scott Brown's victory gave the GOP an ability they had lacked, the strength to sustain a filibuster, a form of opposition that requires supporters of a bill to post 60 Senate votes in order to cut off debate and force a final decision.

Democrats went into something of a political fetal position, and have begun to stir in recent days only as Obama asserted his determination with a bipartisan summit followed by a revised set of proposals.

Obama said the use of rules that deny the minority the right
