AREA MOVIES

ALICE IN WONDERLAND (Y) **
Alice has grown — not by "drink me" potion or "eat me" cake — into a 19-year-old girl in Tim Burton's adaptation of Lewis Carroll's classic tale. Working from Linda Woolverton's very Hollywood adaptation, Burton shifts the story from a child Alice to a near-adult Alice (the startlingly promising Mia Wasikowska). This is Alice's second journey down the rabbit hole, though she doesn't recall the first. This time is less "Who-o-o are you-o-o?" self-discovery, but a formulaic (if madcap) tale of proving oneself. One misses the light wit and the "simple and loving heart of her childhood" from Carroll's book. Burton's film is whimsical and several moments glimmer — the big slobbering tongue of a Bandersnatch, the tweaky March Hare — but it's heavy with the dread of Danny Elfman's score and the impersonal rebooting of Alice as dragon-slayer. Helena Bonham Carter is brilliant as the thin-skinned and bigheaded Red Queen. Johnny Depp's Mad Hatter is rootless but entertaining. The Cheshire Cat, voiced by Stephen Fry, feels like a bow made out of courtesy. No, this is a dog's movie: Bernard the Bloodhound is one of the finer movie mutts in some time. PG for fantasy action-violence involving scary images and situations, and for a smoking caterpillar. 109 minutes.

COP OUT (Y-ve) ** Bruce Willis, Tracy Morgan and a host of supporting actors labor through this derivative buddy-

cop comedy set in Brooklyn. Nonstop hijinks. Not too many laughs. 1 hr. 50 R (pervasive profanity, violence, sexual content).

DEAR JOHN (Y) ** Moist, star-crossed romance from the Nicholas Sparks novel. It features the attractive and sensitive Amanda Seyfried and Channing Tatum as young lovers separated by war and duty. Lasse Hallstrom's movie opens promisingly, but fails to build, as though focused on the wrong end of the hourglass. 1 hr. 45 PG-13 (sensuality, battle scenes)

EDGE OF DARKNESS (Ve) **1/2. Mel Gibson returns in front of the camera, playing a bereaved Boston cop in search

of his daughter's killers and turning up a sinister conspiracy in the process. A strange and gloomy mashup of "Mystic River," "Silkwood" and over-the-top James Bond villainy. 1 hr. 57 R (violence, profanity, adult themes)

THE PRINCESS AND THE FROG (Ve) *** The Walt Disney Co. gets back to old-school, pen-and-ink animation with this 2-D (and proud of it) cartoon inspired by the classic fairy tale transplanted to jazz-Age New Orleans and boasting the first African-American heroine in Disney animation history. Directed by "The Little Mermaid" team of Ron Clements and John Musker. G

TOOTH FAIRY (T-Vi) *1/2. Despite his

high-beam smile and self-mocking style, Dwayne Johnson (a/k/a The Rock) does not elicit many laughs in this unfunny comedy about a bubble-bursting hockey player who disillusioned kids and is sentenced to Tooth Fairy detail. 1 hr. 41 PG (mild language, rude humor)

VALENTINE'S DAY (Y) *** Garry Marshall's all-star candy sampler, conflicted in the mold of "Love, Actually" and starring Ashton Kutcher, Jennifer Garner, Jamie Foxx, Anne Hathaway, Taylor Swift and George Lopez as the Angelenos

whose romantic destinies converge, diverge and cloverleaf like the LA interstates. 2 hrs. PG-13 (risque language, sexual candor)

WHEN IN ROME (Y) * When in Rome, do as the rom-coms do? If only. This frantic and unfunny affair starring Kristen Bell as an unlucky-in-love workaholic and Josh Duhamel as an awkward sports columnist is a rom-bomb. With Danny DeVito, Anjelica Huston and Dax Shepard. 1 hr. 31 PG-13 (suggestive content)
