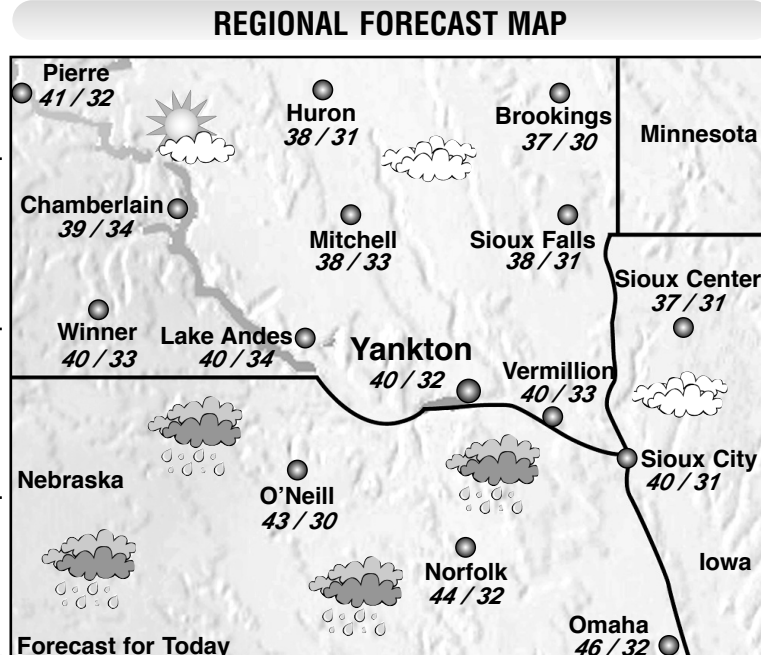

Tabor Chamber, Post Office Announce 2010 Stamp Cancellation Design Contest

TABOR — The Tabor Chamber of Commerce and the Tabor Post Office has announced the 2010 stamp cancellation design contest, which will be held in conjunction with the 2010 Czech Days celebration.

The winner will have the honor of his or her design made into a rubber mold canceling device which will be used to cancel stamps and commemorative cachet's on Friday, June 18, during the Czech Days celebration. In addition prizes will be awarded for first, second and third place entries.

There will be no age limit and all entries must be postmarked no later than March 17 with no exceptions. Send entries to: Chamber of Commerce, PO Box 21, Tabor SD 57063-0021 or they can be dropped off at the Tabor Post Office no later than March 19.

Contest rules: entry must be submitted on an 8 1/2 x 11 paper; the cancellation must be kept simple in design as it will be reduced in size to 2 x 4 inches; design must depict a Czech/Slovak heritage theme; design has to be in black & white; design must have; Tabor SD 57063, the date of June 18, 2010, and the word "station" or "sta." somewhere on the design; your name, address and telephone number must be on back of entry. Once you have submitted your entry you are giving permission to use the artwork for all Czech Days projects.

Winners will be announced in June prior to Czech Days, and prizes will be awarded in Sokol Park on Saturday, June 19.
