Yankton resident Brian VanDeRostyne became an Eagle Scout on Nov. 5, 2009. His Eagle Scout Court of Honor ceremony was held on Feb. 20.

VanDeRostyne began his scouting experience in Sioux Falls in the fall of 1998 and has continued with the Scouting program ever since. During his time with the program he has held such leadership positions as grub-master, quartermaster, assistant patrol leader, patrol leader and senior patrol leader. He joined Troop 133 in Yankton, where he has lived since 2006.

For his Eagle Project, Brian, with the help of troop volunteers, planned and constructed a five 28 target 3-D semi-permanent archery ranges on City of Yankton property for the National Field Archery Association. The range was used for the World 3-D Championship with archers from Europe, Australia and other nations and held in Yankton June 11-14, 2009, and will be used for other local, state and national tournaments.

On Aug. 14, 2009, VanDeRostyne was inducted into the Order of the Arrow, Tetonwana Lodge No. 105. Brian is currently an Assistant Scoutmaster with Troop 133, Yankton. His involvement in scouting has provided him the opportunity to participate in two high adventure camps; Philmont

ARMY SGT. 1ST CLASS JOSHUA KOPP

Kopp, a mortar section leader, is assigned to the 1st Squadron, 40th Cavalry Regiment. He has 19 years of military service.
