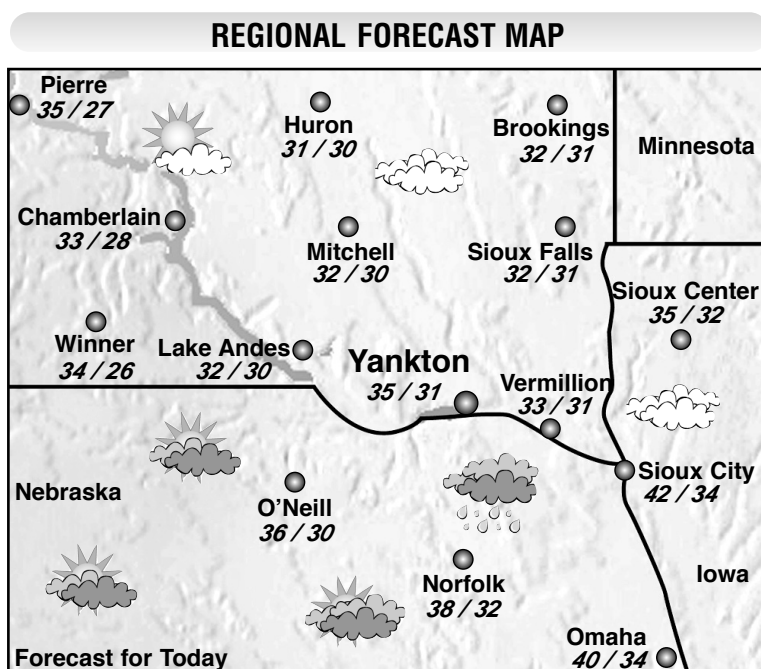

# March 15 Deadline For Property Tax Reductions For New Homeowners

PIERRE — South Dakota homeowners who changed residences last year have until Monday, March 15, to file for the owner-occupied, single-family dwelling certificates that make them eligible for a reduction in property taxes.

South Dakota homeowners who owned and occupied homes on Nov. 1, 2009, are eligible for the classification and property tax reductions, the Governor said.

Taxpayers who received the reductions previously and still own and occupy the same homes will continue to receive property tax reductions without filing new certificates. It is not necessary for them to file again.

The 2010 valuation notices that taxpayers have received will indicate if their homes are classified as owner-occupied. Homeowners are advised to check those notices to make sure their property is classified as owner-occupied for the lower tax rate.

People who purchased existing homes last year to live in, built new residences last year

before Nov. 1, 2009, or have previously not applied for the owner-occupied classification must apply to their county director of equalization by March 15. Applications postmarked by March 15 will qualify.

Homeowners needing forms or with questions about the owner-occupied certificates should contact their county director of equalization or the Property and Special Taxes Division of the South Dakota Department of Revenue and Regulation in Pierre at 605-773-3139.

dry and the rafters solid, any extra money we have collected will be rolled over to stage two."

During the last four years, the theater has made many upgrades to the facility, including a new computer and reservation system, new spot lighting equipment, a new piano, an upgraded sound system and a new furnace and air-conditioning unit.

With the installation of the latter items, the theater saw its monthly utilities bill go from \$3,200 to \$2,300 a month, and Lambert expects the restoration to save them substantially more.

Because the materials used to finish the roof require heat, the project start date is tentatively set for June 15. That gives Lambert and the theatre board three months to raise the needed funds.

"The city and the county have both pledged \$6,000 each toward the project," Lambert said. "That will help us, because many of the grants we are applying for do require matching funds. We have also applied for grants from Midcontinent Communications, the City of Deadwood Grant and the State of South Dakota Deadwood Grant among many others."

The theatre board and Lambert also plan on visiting with area groups explaining the project. They are also considering offering a payroll deduction to area employees.

Lambert admits that money is tight right now, but he believes the Yankton area will step up to help save the structure. He also added, that even if people can't donate money, the theater always needs volunteers.

"We are going to be out there fundraising," Lambert said. "People are going to get used to seeing me begging for money. But I think once the momentum gets going, the response from the community will be phenomenal."
