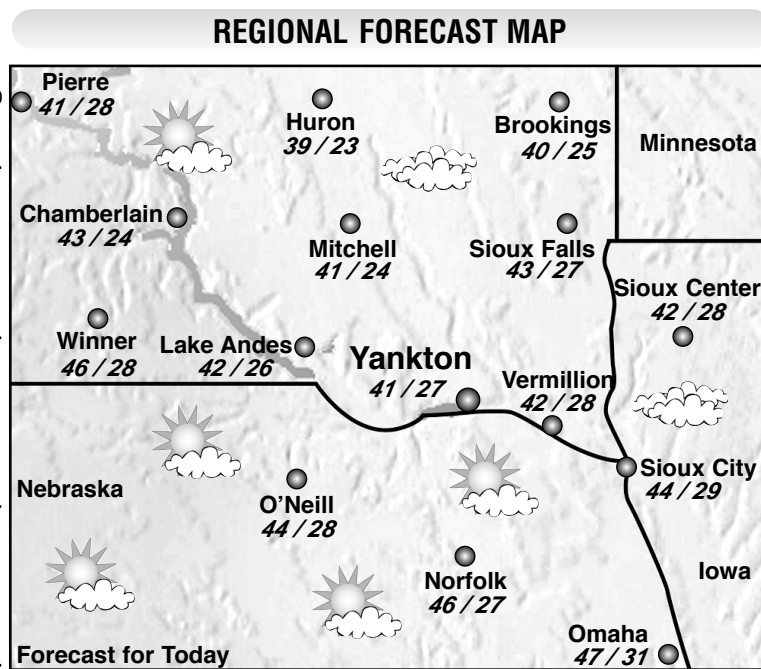

Yankton Crews Avert Flooding Situation

Flooding near the intersection of Bill Baggs Road and Alumax Drive on the east side of Yankton Sunday afternoon had city employees up all night.

City crews were alerted to the situation late Sunday afternoon, according to Kyle Goodmanson, Yankton's director of Environmental Services.

Snow in the ditch along the west side of Bill Baggs Road was not allowing water to flow. Eventually, the water backed up into nearby fields. The real problem began when the water got high enough to flow into two manholes near the train tracks along Alumax Drive.

"The storm water coming into our sanitary sewer system is too much for our lift station to handle," Goodmanson said. If the lift station became flooded, the pumps and other equipment inside it would be destroyed.

The city street department brought a backhoe out to clear the ditch so the water could flow. Additionally, the fire department brought out a truck and water was sprayed on the snow to remove it. A vacuum truck was also on the scene to suck water out of one of the manholes. The water was then disposed of at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

About a dozen people from the aforementioned agencies, as well as the water distribution and collection department, worked until midnight to clear up the situation. The vacuum truck was brought out again at 3:30 a.m. and took away water until around 8 a.m.

"It was a long night for the guys," Goodmanson said, noting his own lack of sleep the previous night due to the situation. "Our main goal was to save the lift station, and we accomplished that."

FEMA Awards South Dakota \$250,000 For Assistance For Non-Emergency Situations

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has announced that \$250,000 has been awarded to South Dakota by the Emergency Food and Shelter Program (EFSP) to supplement food, shelter, rent, mortgage, and utility assistance programs for people with non-disaster related emergencies.

Funding will be allocated to Local Recipient Organizations (LRO's) by the State Set-Aside Committee using a formula based on current unemployment, poverty and household median income data from the entire state. The Local Boards of each LRO will then determine how those funds will be distributed to qualified agencies in the counties that they oversee.

Public or private voluntary agencies interested in applying for Emergency Food and Shelter Program funds must: 1) be non-profit 2) have accounting capabilities 3) practice non-discrimination 4) demonstrate ability to deliver emergency food and/or shelter services 5) convene a voluntary board (if a private entity).

Agencies interested in applying for funding can contact Matt Gassen, the State Set-Aside Committee Chair, at (605) 335-0364 for information on where to apply for funding. Current participating LRO's are not required to re-apply for funding during this phase, but should notify the State Set-Aside committee if they are considering changing their status as an LRO.

Deadline for applications is no later than March 26.
