vote as a result of her opposition, I will probably have to go up against her," Hildebrand said.

Herseth Sandlin, in her weekly telephone news conference with South Dakota reporters, said she will not support the Senate version of health care reform or a reconciliation package. A House vote on the bill could come as early as Sunday.

The congresswoman said she also will not support a Democratic plan to use a special procedure that would let the House approve the \$940 billion measure without a direct vote. Such a move would worsen an already bad atmosphere between Democrats and Republicans, making it more difficult to solve other problems, she said.

Herseth Sandlin said the current health care situation is unacceptable, but Congress should focus on things both parties support, such as preventing insurance companies from excluding people with pre-existing conditions or canceling coverage when someone gets sick.

"These are achievable in a more fiscally responsible form than the alternative proposal before Congress," she said. Hildebrand said Herseth Sandlin failed to live up to her promise to support health care reform. Her opposition to the bill appeared to be "more about politics than about policy," he said.

"I don't long to be a member of Congress, but I do have tremendous frustration in her voting pattern that is out of sync with what she promised people she would do," Hildebrand said.

He also said Herseth Sandlin hasn't given sound reasons for her opposition to the health care bill.

"I don't see that she has fought to make changes to the bill. I don't see that her voice is really that strong in Congress," he said. "She sits there in the majority where we can really get things done, but she sits on the sideline."

Rural Economic Index Doubles March '09 Mark

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — A new survey of rural bankers in 11 Midwest and Plains states shows continued weakness in the agriculture industry, but also signs of improvement. The overall index for the Rural Mainstreet economic report released late Thursday rose to 47.4 in March from February's 36.6. That's more than double last March's reading of 18.7.

The index ranges between 0 and 100. A score below 50 suggests the economy will contract in the next few months; above 50 indicates the economy will expand. The index has remained below 50 for 25 consecutive months. Bankers from Colorado, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota and Wyoming were surveyed.

happen if they choose to participate in risky behavior or other poor decision-making activities while in an automobile (as a passenger or driver). Hall said that the emotional consequences that the students will encounter during this portion of the class have the longest lasting impact of the day. "You know you can say, 'This is what will happen if you speed. This is what will happen if you drink and drive.' But, sometimes seeing or hearing the stories

about what those choices have meant for other drivers or parents of other drivers will really impact them." Because the class is an open discussion rather than a lecture based program, the instructor Mike Kane will be able to use the experiences and reactions of the class to tailor the lesson to leave the longest lasting impact to help the students become more conscientious drivers. "This class is an eye opener," Hall said. "It is designed to open the young drivers eyes to what happens." With good reason. According to Hall, in terms of South Dakota accident/fatality percentages specifically the young driver population repre-

sents about 16 1/2 percent of the drivers on the road. Yet, they represent about 39 percent of all the drinking-related fatal crashes and they represent about 56 percent of all the speeding fatalities and crashes. The courses being offered do not include any behind-the-wheel instruction. However, Hall said if parents are interested in having their children be a part of that type of instruction, it is available through the SDSC office in Sioux Falls. The upcoming classes will be offered at the Regional Technical Education Center Thursday, June 10. There is a fee for the instruction and space is limited.
