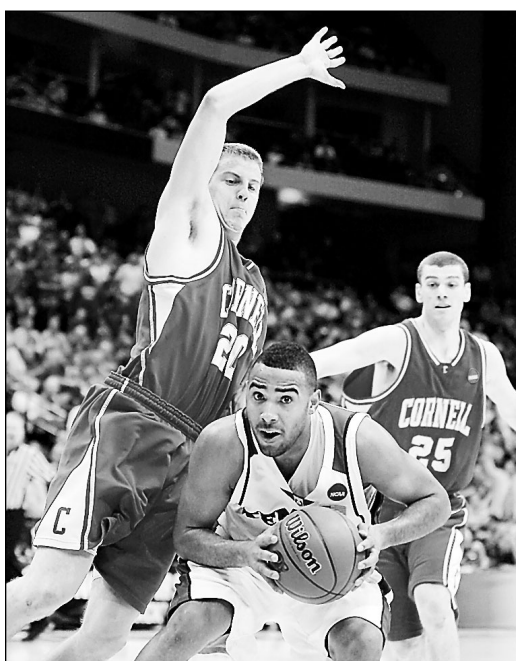

Black Hills State Coach To Succeed Meyer At Northern State

ABERDEEN (AP) — Black Hills State men's basketball coach Paul Sather will succeed coaching legend Don Meyer at Northern State.

The NCAA Division II school in Aberdeen made the announcement Friday following a national search. Sather has spent the past five seasons as the head coach at Black Hills State, an NAIA school in Spearfish. He is a former Northern State assistant coach and player, and Northern State President James Smith says Sather's connection to the school was a factor in his hiring.

The 65-year-old Meyer is battling health problems and retiring. He is one of the winningest men's basketball coaches in history, with more than 900 wins. In January 2009, he broke Bob Knight's NCAA record of 902 wins. This April, he is to receive the Legends of the Hardwood Award at the NCAA Final Four.
