State and No. 2 Ohio State plays No. 6 Tennessee. In the East on Thursday, No. 1 Kentucky plays Cornell — Big Blue vs. the Big Red — while Washington faces No. 2 West Virginia. In the South semifinals Friday, No. 3 Baylor will play Saint Mary's, while No. 1 Duke plays No. 4 Purdue. And the West is mid-major country: No. 2 Kansas State advanced to play Xavier, and No. 1 Syracuse will play Butler on Thursday. The Bulldogs and Musketeers used to be among the poster children for the small-school darlings. But in a sign of how upside-down this tournament has been, their trips to the regional semis haven't made a huge splash outside of their hometowns of Indy and Cindy. "I don't think there's the mid-major anymore when you get into the NCAA tournament," said Ohio State coach Thad Matta, who used to coach Xavier. Instead, the loudest noise came from those in double digits — and the upsets were spread among big conferences and small.

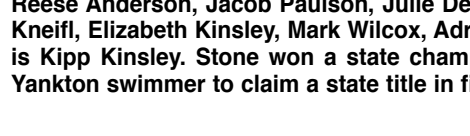

TEMP, Ariz. — The University of South Dakota track and field teams started the 2010 outdoor season on the right foot by setting several solid marks on Saturday at the Baldy Castillo Invitational in Arizona State University's Sun Angel Stadium. On the men's side, several young sprinters continued to impress. Freshmen Jeremy Blount, Brandon Kovash, Michael Burrus and Matt Kerswill combined to finish second in the 4x100-meter relay in 41.24. Their time was just 4 of a second away from the school record. Kerswill and Blount also finished fourth (10.69) and seventh (10.89) in the 100 meters, respectively. Senior Dominic Artis finished third in the event in 10.68. Freshman Casey Shade ran a personal-best 1:52 to finish seventh in the 800 meters. The USD women also notched several good marks.
