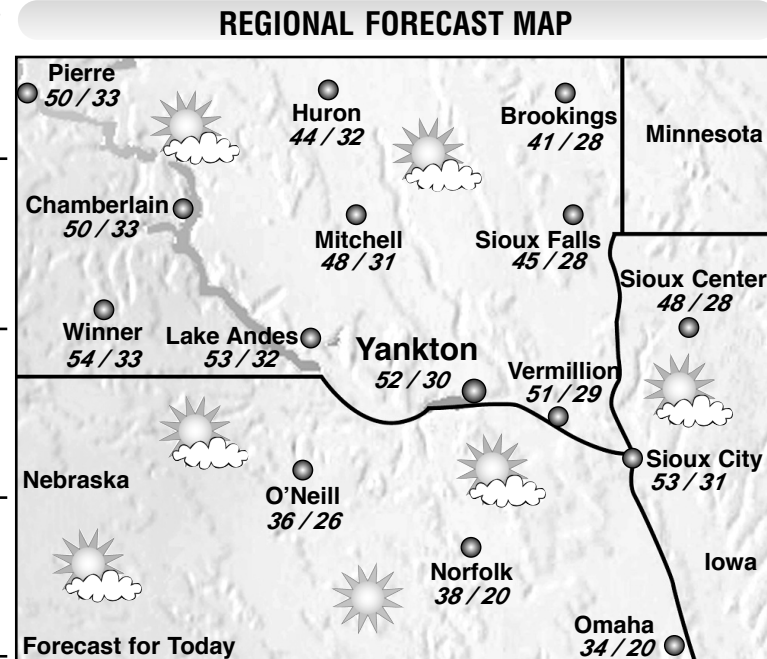

## ON THIS DATE

### 75 YEARS AGO

**Monday, March 25, 1935**

The long-awaited press conference between Great Britain and Germany got under way today when Reichsfuehrer Hitler of Germany talked personally with British officials in the chancellery in Berlin. The German leader told his guests of Germany's armanent program and desires. Their talks will continue tomorrow.

Speculation which began to buzz a month ago, when former President Hoover broke a long silence to urge immediate stabilization of the dollar and return to the gold standard, flared high today at his outspoken attack on administration policies, made in a message to the California Republican assembly.

### 50 YEARS AGO

**Friday, March 25, 1960**

Two mean, armed convicts who had threatened a mass murder of 19 hostages walked quietly from a captured office at the Tennessee penitentiary Thursday, ending a dramatic 25-hour siege.

British Prime Minister Harold Macmillan is expected to urge President Eisenhower to agree to a modified version of the Soviet proposal for banning nuclear weapons tests. He is understood to favor a time limit of about two years on the proposed moratorium on small underground tests.

### 25 YEARS AGO

**Monday, March 25, 1985**

South Dakota Governor William Janklow genty chided the Yankton City Commission last week for its inquiry into the use of prison trusty labor at the state Human Services Center, saying his concern is not what's best for Yankton, but what's best for South Dakota.

A Soviet guard shot and killed an unarmed U.S. Army officer of the American military mission in East Germany and the United States lodged a 'serious protest' over the incident, U.S. authorities said today.

Wheat for May delivery edged down 0.75 cent to \$4.76 a bushel, while May corn added 2.25 cents to \$3.65 a bushel and oats for May delivery fell 1.5 cents to \$2.15 a bushel. May soybeans dropped 8 cents to \$9.60 a bushel.
Meanwhile, beef futures advanced and pork futures traded mixed on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.
June live cattle gained 0.5 cent to 92.87 cents a pound; May feeder cattle climbed 0.77 cent to \$1.0952 a pound; June lean hogs slid 1.33 cents to 80.72 cents a pound; and May pork bellies rose 0.55 cent to 96.7 cents a pound.
