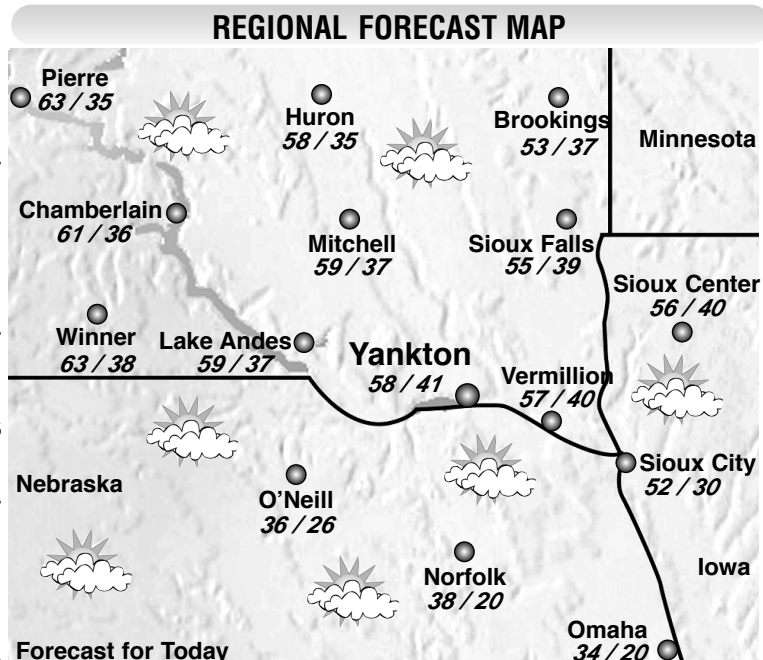

U Students Make Film Festival Finalists

VERMILLION — Four short films by students from The University of South Dakota are finalists in this Saturday's Siouxland Film Festival at the Orpheum Theatre in Sioux City, Iowa. "Night Crew" by Kyle Nickolite, a contemporary media and journalism student from Yankton.; "Room Cleaning" by John Larson, a contemporary media and journalism student from Chamberlain; and two films by recent contemporary media and journalism graduate Skye Giebink of Sioux Falls, "Chicken Soup: Cooking with Stop Motion" and "Serving Kevin Fischer," were chosen to compete in the evening awards screening. These shorts will go head-to-head against entries from the University of Texas, the California Institute of the Arts, Chapman University, the Rochester Institute of the Arts and others. A total of 10 entries from USD students were accepted into the festival, including "I Love the Smell of Hazelnut" and "You Can See" by College of Fine Arts student Nathan Hoffman from Madison; "Death to the Bunny" and "I'm a Yote" by CMJ students Chris Kirkeby of Rapid City and Nickolite, "Dear Mailbox" by College of Fine Arts student David Lethcoe and "The Bike Ride" by Larson. The films were produced for Digital Filmmaking and Directing for Video and Film classes at USD as well as KYOT-TV. The USD classes are taught by Professor Tim Case of Integrated Arts and Todd Mechling, instructor for contemporary media and journalism and an advisor to KYOT-TV. The evening session of the Siouxland Film Festival is at 7 p.m. Saturday, March 27, with Giebink's film, "Chicken Soup and Cooking in Slow Motion," scheduled for first showing. Flood Gauge Installed On Jim River

In response to a request from local officials and residents, a temporary gauge has been installed on the James River at Johnson Bridge in central Yankton County. At its last meeting, the James River Water Development District (JRWD) declared the gauge an emergency because of flooding. JRWD manager Darrell Raschke told the Press & Dakotan Thursday. The JRWD board then allocated \$30,000 for purchasing the gauge and its first year of operation and maintenance, Raschke said. The federal government will pay 50 percent of the cost, with 25 percent each from the JRWD and Yankton County, he said. A permanent gauge will be installed after the flood water recedes, Raschke said. The gauge's reading can be found online by using the Yankton link at <http://waterdata.usgs.gov/nwis/uv/> 06478513.
