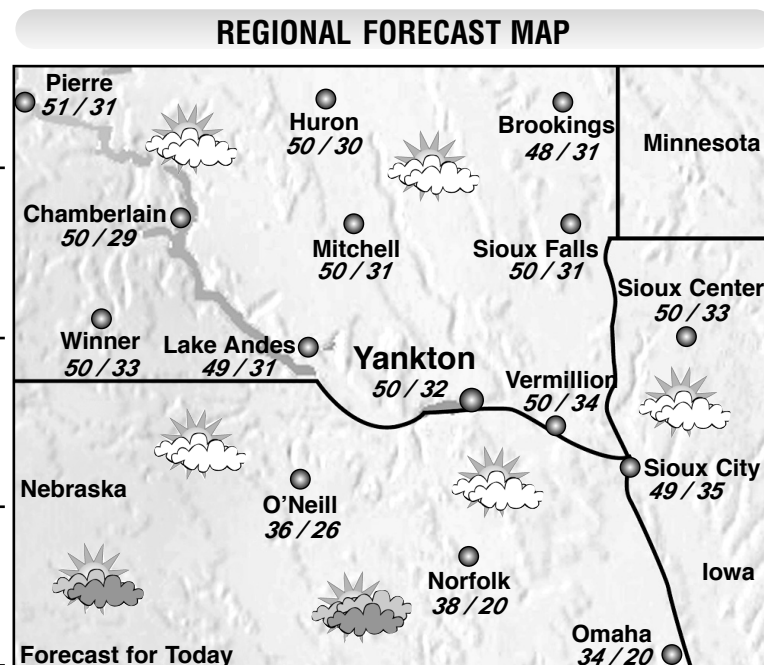

Unemployment Drops In Yankton, Area Counties In February

The unemployment rate in Yankton continued to decline in February, according to data released Friday by the South Dakota Department of Labor. Since November, when the city's unemployment rate stood at 7.3 percent, the jobless rate has been slowly declining. Unemployment was 6.1 percent in February, down from 6.3 percent in January.

Rapid City had the highest unemployment among the state's largest cities with 6.5 percent. Watertown was second with 6.4 percent.

The number of unemployed in Yankton fell from 480 in January to 470 in February. Meanwhile, the size of Yankton's labor force grew slightly from 7,645 in January to 7,680 in February.

The unemployment rate for Yankton County was 5.2 percent, or 610 people. That is down from 5.3 percent in January. Vermillion had the lowest unemployment rate in the state with 3.5 percent. Pierre had a 3.9 percent unemployment rate. Sioux Falls was at 5.7 percent, while Mitchell stood at 5.8 percent.

Unemployment in six of seven area counties went down in February.

The February unemployment rates in area counties were:

- 5.1 percent in Bon Homme County, down from 5.4 percent in January;
- 4.4 percent in Cedar County (Neb.), the same as in January;
- 4.5 percent in Charles Mix County, down from 4.8 percent in January;
- 3.6 percent in Clay County, down from 3.9 percent in January;
- 4.4 percent in Hutchinson County, down from 4.6 percent in January;
- 5.4 percent in Knox County (Neb.), down from 5.3 percent in January; and
- 5.9 percent in Turner County, down from 6.4 percent in January.

CHICAGO BOARD OF TRADE

Agriculture futures were mixed Friday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for May delivery lost 1.75 cents to \$4.6475 a bushel, while May corn added 1.25 cents to \$3.5625 a bushel and oats for May delivery climbed 5.25 cents to \$2.12 a bushel. May soybeans jumped 9.5 cents to \$9.52 a bushel.

Meanwhile, beef and pork futures traded lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle edged down 0.55 cent to 91.57 cents a pound; May feeder cattle fell 0.72 cent to \$1.0815 a pound; June lean hogs shed 1.6 cents to 78.02 cents a pound; and May pork bellies slid 1.25 cents to 93.7 cents a pound.
