Girls honorees are Shaunteva Ashley of Sioux Falls Roosevelt, Class AA; Christian Jans of Pine Ridge, Class A and Hillary Paulson of Freeman, Class B. All of the players are seniors. • Hanning, a 6-foot-3 guard, averaged 21.6 points and 7.7 rebounds per game for Aberdeen Central, which finished second in the state Class AA tournament. • Brown, a 6-0 guard, pooled in 27.3 points and also collected 6.3 rebounds per game. • Tolmsa, a 6-2 forward, collected 21.1 points and 7.3 rebounds per game this season. • Ashley, a 5-8 guard, produced 19.5 points and 4.7 rebounds per game while leading Roosevelt to the consolation championship in the state Class AA tournament. • Jans, a 5-8 guard, scored 30.1 points per game for Pine Ridge, which finished third in the state Class A tournament. • Paulson, a 6-0 forward, averaged 24.3 points per game for Freeman, which was sixth in the state Class B tournament.

USD Men Claim 5th Place Finish At Hal Sutton Intercollegiate

HAUGHTON, La. — The University of South Dakota men's golf team improved its position during the final round of the Hal Sutton Intercollegiate Tuesday at the Olde Oaks Golf Club in Haughton, La. The Coyotes shot a team score of 308 and finished the 54-hole event at 932, passing North Dakota for the fifth spot. Senior Jim Walsh capped off an outstanding tournament by tying for fifth overall. Walsh shot an even-par 72 to finish at five-over-par 221 (78-71-72). Walsh's 72 on Tuesday was tied for the third-best score of the day. Freshman Ben Heller added a 79 Tuesday to finish at 238 (78-81-79), while freshman Ty Munneke also finished at 238 (83-74-81) after shooting an 83 during the final round. Binghamton won the tournament at 882, with Centenary's Nick Falitz winning the overall title with an even-par 216. The USD men return to action next Monday when they host the Coyote Invite. The two-day event, which concludes next Tuesday, will have a field of teams including Augustana, Northwestern, Sioux Falls, Northern State and Concordia-Moorhead.

UNC Beat Rhode Island In NIT Semis

NEW YORK (AP) — North Carolina will get to play for another title after all. Deon Thompson had 16 points and 13 rebounds, and fourth-seeded North Carolina punched a frantic final few seconds to defeat Rhode Island 68-67 in overtime Thursday night and reach the NIT championship game. Will Graves added 14 points and Tyler Zeller 13 for the Tar Heels (20-16), who will try to make some bitterness history Thursday night against Dayton by becoming the first school to follow a national title with an NIT title. North Carolina had the ball with about 5 seconds remaining in overtime and the shot clock about to expire when Larry Drew II forced up a wild shot. The rebound eventually wound up in the hands of Rhode Island forward DeRoy James, who lost control as he rushed up court moments before the buzzer sounded, never coming close to getting off a shot.
