GRAIN FUTURES DOWN, LIVESTOCK PRICES RISE

CHICAGO (AP) — Grains futures traded lower Wednesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for May delivery fell 21 cents to \$7.5875 a bushel; May corn fell 4.50 cents to \$7.01 a bushel; May oats were down 8 cents to \$3.67 a bushel; while soybeans for May delivery dropped 33 cents to \$13.49 a bushel.

Beef and pork traded higher on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

April live cattle gained 2.72 cents to \$1.1752 a pound; April feeder cattle added 1.37 cent to \$1.3452 a pound; April lean hogs rose 0.63 cent to 89.75 cents a pound; while March pork bellies added 0.50 cent to \$1.1700 a pound.
