



Annual Missouri River Futures Conservation Workshop Set

VERMILION — The fourth annual Missouri River Futures Conservation Workshop (MRFCW) will be held Wednesday, March 30, in Vermillion at the Clay County 4-H Center on 515 High Street. This workshop will be open from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. and is open and free to the public.

The focus of this event is to provide information on several aspects of the Missouri National Recreational River and meet some of the many people who work and live along it. The workshop will feature information on youth and adult education, recreation, program activities, and other aspects of living and working along the Missouri River. This year's special topics include invasive species, current conservation opportuni-

ties, and a two-stage rainfall/infiltration simulator demonstration. There are too many times of interest to list, so come and check them all out.

Missouri River Futures (MRF) was established in 2004 to coordinate efforts from various agencies and private landowners on Missouri River issues. The MRF primarily focuses its efforts on the 39-mile and 59-mile segments of the Missouri National Recreational River (MNRR). More than 35 different federal, state, local, and non-profit organizations are working on issues regarding the MNRR.
