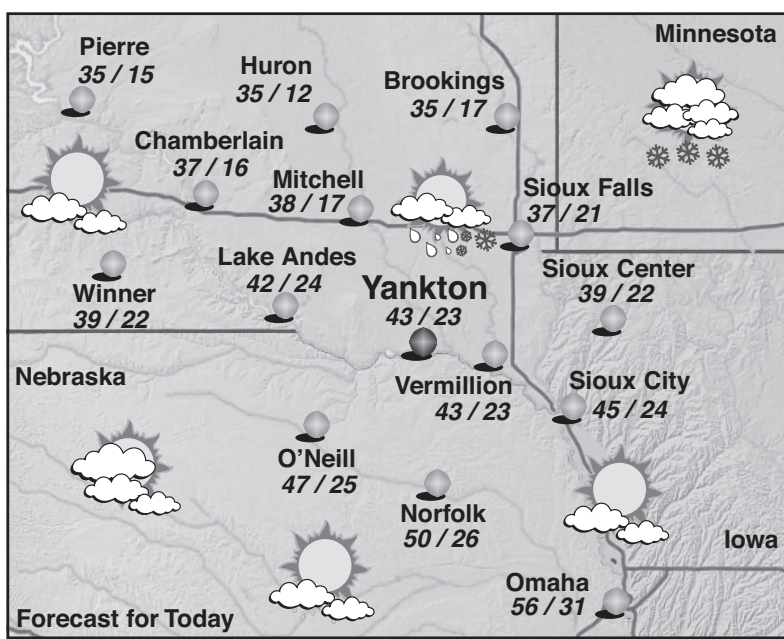

SIoux FALLS — American agriculture provides the necessities of everyday life: food, fiber, clothing, and now fuel. That's the message that farmers will share with South Dakota youth March 5-16 to celebrate National Ag Week, which is March 4-10.

A local dairy farmer and pork producer will educate students on how they care for their livestock and help them understand how South Dakota's number one industry affects nutrition and food supply.

"The impact on South Dakota's economy alone from agriculture is over \$20 billion," said Steve Rommereim, Ag United President and Alcester farmer.

75 YEARS AGO

Monday, March 1, 1937. At a meeting of the Yankton county organization of the Farmers Union held at Welby school on Saturday, a committee was named to make investigation into the possibility of the establishment of a power alcohol plant in this section of the state, possibly at Yankton, as a means of extending the farm crops that could be produced in

this part of South Dakota and taking care of standard crop surpluses.

Approval of a bill appropriating \$5,000 for rattlesnake eradication in South Dakota occupied the house of representatives at its Saturday morning session. This measure passed 91 to 9 after several members spoke for it.

50 YEARS AGO

Thursday, March 1, 1962. Shoveling not all ground work.

Cleaning off roofs became a risky but necessary chore after some 18 inches of snow fell in the Yankton vicinity the latter part of February. Typical example is at the Mikkelson Home which was being shoveled Tuesday. Roofs and eave-troughs were unable to bear the weight of the snow and seepage, and home owners were complaining their houses were unusually damp and cold.

Astronaut John H. Glenn Jr. says that the day will come when man will

cruise in the skies much as he now maneuvers his automobile on the highways. To travel in space like that, Glenn said in congressional testimony Wednesday, spacecraft many times more powerful than the Friendship 7 in which he orbited the globe three times will have to be developed.
