Reid's office did not immediately respond to a request for comment Wednesday evening.

However welcome by the national party, Kerrey's late decision is sure to create state party friction. Fellow Democrat Chuck Hassebrook stepped into the race after Kerrey bowed out, giving up a chance to run again for a University of Nebraska regent seat he's held for nearly 18 years.

Hassebrook has vowed to stay in the race, despite understanding that Kerrey will inherit Nelson's campaign team and presumably much of the nearly \$3 million Nelson amassed for a re-election bid before announcing his retirement.

Kerrey said he "can understand why" his lastminute bid has created a rift.

"I don't know that it's mendable," Kerrey said. "I apologized to Chuck when I talked to him, and I do so again now."

The state party won't be taking sides, said chairman Vic Covalt.

The Nebraska Democratic Party does not typically endorse candidates for office prior to the primary election in contested races, nor do we discourage anyone from running for office," Covalt said in a statement.

Former Nebraska GOP chairman and 2006 Senate candidate David Kramer said Kerrey's re-emergence takes what could have been a relatively low profile Nebraska race "into probably a full-fledged battle for what could be a toss-up."

'The expectation on a national level will be that he provides the Democrats with a better opportunity to hold that seat, and when every seat is going to matter, having that kind of cachet matters," Kramer said.

Kerrey's turnaround is the latest lurch in what has been a roller coaster ride for Nebraska Democrats since Nelson's surprise December announcement that he would not seek a third term this year.

Kerrey said soon after that he would consider running for the seat he had held from 1989a six-day visit to Nebraska to consult friends and family about a run. It was weeks after the visit that Kerrey initially demurred, and another three before he announced he had changed his mind again. The back-and-forth should come as little surprise coming from Kerry, a man affectionately dubbed "Cosmic Bob" while he was senator for his tendency to ponder decisions and change his mind on any number of issues, Kramer said.

Saturday, he joined a small pocket of Oakland faithful during the doubleheader against the University of South Dakota at the DakotaDome in Vermillion.

"At the Summit League tourney, there will be quite a few more Oakland alumni and school people than there were at the USD game," he said.

Oakland's basketball appearances in Gross's backyard have rekindled his interest in his alma mater. He is one of the school's earliest graduates, earning a bachelor's degree in 1969 with a double major in English and social studies education.

"I was looking for a school that was challenging in the classroom," he said. 'My sister was attending Mount Holvoke (in Massachusetts), and her boyfriend from Detroit said I should go to Oakland. I applied and was accepted. I went there without ever seeing it.'

Oakland University was created in 1957 when the late Alfred and Matilda Wilson donated \$2 million and their 1,500-acre estate to Michigan State University to start a new college in Oakland County.

Named Michigan State University-Oakland, the college opened in 1959 with 570 students. Its charter class graduated in 1963 with 125 students receiving diplomas. The college's name changed to Oakland University in 1963.

In 1970, the Michigan Legislature granted autonomy to Oakland, and Michigan's governor appointed the college's first board of trustees.

When Gross arrived on campus in the 1960s, the school enrolled about 3,300 students. Today, more than 18,000 students attend classes at OU, and the alumni number more than 80,000.

Oakland started as a liberal arts college and developed business and engineering programs, Gross said.

There was tremendous diversity on the campus," he said. "There is so little diversity in South Dakota, which made attending Oakland that much more interesting. I was in awe of the kids who grew up in Detroit and other urban areas of Michigan. But ultimately, they were no different than me."

After graduating in December 1969, Gross substitute taught for a semester. He returned to Yankton in spring 1970. He didn't visit the Oakland campus for more than two decades and was struck by the school's changes.

"There was quite a difference between the 1960s, when I attended, and the 1990s when my two daughters visited campus," he said. "Now, they have new recreation facilities, a new library and a new business school."

Gross has reconnected with Oakland thanks to the Summit League games.

"I am reaching the stage of life where I'm reflective," he said. "I'm always grateful for the outstanding professors and the education that I received at Oakland. It was such a unique experience for a kid from South Dakota."


Others believe Kerrey's indecision will factor into the race.

"It will be harder for him to explain and be serious about this," said University of Nebraska Lincoln political science professor Mike Wagner. "You don't want to spend too much of the time in the campaign that you're serious about running. That ought to be assumed, and I don't know that it is for him.'

Republicans have wasted no time launching renewed attacks on Kerrey. The National Republican Senatorial Committee put out a statement calling Kerrey "a taxand-spend liberal" and suggesting his candidacy stems from "backroom deal-making."

The GOP's Senate primary ticket in Nebraska already is crowded.

It includes state Attorney General Jon Bruning, state Treasurer Don Stenberg, state Sen. Deb Fischer, and investment adviser Pat Flynn. A fifth candidate, Steven Zimmerman, has filed for candidacy, but has raised no money since joining the race last year.
