Federal regulations require anyone applying for a new, renewal or duplicate driver license or identification card to provide the documents listed below (photo copies are not acceptable):

- ONE of the following to prove identity, date of birth, and lawful status: Certified U.S. birth certificate issued by county or state (no hospital birth-certificates); valid unexpired U.S. passport; Certificate of Naturalization; Certificate of Citizenship; valid unexpired permanent resident card; valid unexpired employment authorization document; foreign passport with

valid unexpired U.S. Visa with I-94

If your name is different than the name on your identity document, you will need to bring additional proof of your legal name. Acceptable documents for proof of legal name change are a certified marriage certificate (issued by a state vital records agency), a certified adoption document, or a certified court order authorizing a name change (such as a divorce decree). If you have had multiple marriages, you will need to bring similar documents providing legal proof of each name change. The examiners must be able to trace from your birth name to your current name.

- ONE document to prove your Social Security number: Social Security card, W-2 Form, SSA 1099 Form, Non-SSA 1099 Form, pay stub (must include name and Social Security number). The regulations do not allow personnel to accept any other document as proof of Social Security number.
- TWO documents to prove your residential address. A parent's proof of address is acceptable for a minor child. Bring two of the documents listed here (each must contain your current address): Utility bill, credit card statement, pay stub or earnings statement, rent receipt, phone bill, transcript or report card from accredited school, bank statement, mortgage document, tax document, homeowners/renter's insurance policy. Other items will be reviewed by licensing personnel. PO Box addresses are acceptable in areas not assigned street or 911 addresses. In South Dakota, if you are unable to provide proof of residency, visit www.dps.sd.gov or call 1-800-952-3696.

NOTE: In South Dakota, application must be submitted at least one hour in advance of scheduled closing time. No drive tests will be given from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m.

### 75 YEARS AGO

Friday, March 5, 1937  
 • The "Yankton bridge bill," amended to meet objections raised against it, was approved by the state senate last night and forwarded to the house for final legislative action today. The measure permits the South Dakota highway department to participate with Nebraska and the federal government in the purchase of the privately owned toll bridge across the Missouri river south of Yankton.  
 • Governor Leslie Jensen's proposal to increase the levies in the upper brackets of the present income tax to protect the finances of the state government in event the new ore tax is held invalid was blocked in the senate last night after the bitterest political scrap of the session.

### 50 YEARS AGO

Monday, March 5, 1962  
 • The Yankton area "weathered" another attack from Mother Nature over the weekend as some five inches of new snow was dumped from the heavens Saturday and Sunday and was whipped around by howling winds. The resulting heavy drifting and snow packed streets brought traffic to a near standstill by Sunday morning.  
 • The Atomic Energy Commission says its atomic power plant at the South Pole is now in operation. The medium-sized portable power plant at McMurdo Sound, the first in the antarctic, achieved a controlled, self-sustained chain reaction Saturday afternoon. After further tests the plant will be used to produce 1,500 net kilowatts of electricity for McMurdo, the principal support base for all U.S. scientific activities in the ice continent.

 • Craig Hatch has been spending his afternoons preparing for the opening of Yankton's Hillcrest Country Club golf course for the season.
