It does not matter what pesticide you apply (herbicide, insecticide, or fungicide, etc.) you need to be certified as a Private Applicator.

Individuals have three options to get certified. You many attend a 3hour recertification class at any certification site, they may stop by at your local Extension Office or Regional Extension Center and pick-up the materials to complete the open-book home-study exam, or they may take the Private Applicator exam on-line at the Department of Agriculture's website: http://apps.sd.gov/doa/pwt/.
