# Transplant

Jason donated his bone marrow stem cells Jan. 30. A successful transplant to his brother occurred the next day.

The worst part of the process was the time leading up to the donation, according to Jason. During the four previous days, he was given medication that caused his body to overproduce bone marrow stem cells. The process made Jason ache and feel nauseated, similar to the flu.

The actual donation procedure wasn't very invasive, Jason said.

"It's basically going in and hooking a large IV into both arms and filtering your blood out," he stated. "There was a needle that went into my right arm that takes all the blood out and runs it through an aphoresis machine. That spins it through a centrifuge, which takes out the stem cells and collects them. The machine takes the rest of the blood and puts it back in my left arm. They did that the equivalent of 1 1/2 times my blood volume."

With Jeff's acute leukemia, the stem cells in his bone marrow had begun to malfunction, and it produced many immature blood cells that interfere with the creation of normal blood cells.

An aggressive radiation and chemotherapy treatment regimen had been used to destroy the abnormal stem and blood cells. But in the process, normal stem cells were destroyed, too.

Infusing Jason's stem cells into Jeff's bloodstream allowed them to get into the cavities of the bones in order to begin producing normal blood cells.

Jeff was able to come home Feb. 27 and is doing well, Jason said.

Through the process, Jason said he learned more than he

ever wanted to know about leukemia and bone marrow transplants. That knowledge has now made him a teacher.

"I learned just how much blood a cancer patient has to receive through infusions," he said. "I was never really a big advocate for giving blood. That made me a huge advocate."

After informing staff at the school about the difficulty patients have finding matches on bone marrow donor lists, Jason said many of them signed up.

"That was the good part of it," he stated. "I didn't know anything about it prior to going into this. I feel as though a lot of people probably don't understand what people with leukemia are going through. A lot of them don't have options because there are no bone marrow matches."

Although Jason ended up taking only one day off from work through the whole ordeal and was even refereeing a basketball game two days after donating, he said the support of the Gayville-Volin School Board meant a lot to him.


"When Jeff went through the initial treatment, which was intensive radiation and chemotherapy, there were a lot of times when it seemed like things were going bad quickly," Jason said. "They gave me time if I needed it. I didn't need to take a lot, but it was nice to know that I could if I needed to."

It's possible that he could be called upon to donate bone marrow to Jeff again. Jason is also now on a national bone marrow donor list.

To help researchers understand the effects of being a bone marrow donor, Jason agreed to take part in a study.


"Right now, they tell you there are no long-lasting effects, but they continue to study it," he said. "After the first month, they found I've had no effects."

County emergency management director, said a crane is being sought to lift the excavator.

"They just can't find the right tool to get it out because it is stuck in the mud," he said. "There is a lot of suction when they try to pull it out."

Precautions have been taken to avoid any environmental pollution such as an oil or fuel leak, Scherschligt said. The state Department of Environment and Natural Resources, as well as other state agencies, have been notified of the situation, he added.

"They're taking the proper precautionary measures to avoid contamination," Scherschligt said. "They have been good to work with and have told me anything I need to know."
