College: GPAC Teams 2-0 At NAI A Women's Tournament

SIoux CITY, Iowa — Concordia benefited from a dazzling display from its backcourt as it cruised to a 78-54 first round victory over Sterling (Kan.) on Thursday at the State Farm-NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Championship in Sioux City, Iowa.

Guard Katie Rich enjoyed a perfect shooting night off the bench for the Bulldogs on the way to a game-high 20 points. Rich shot 7-for-7 from the field, 5-for-5 from the free throw line and drained her only attempt from 3-point range.

Starting guards Kristen Conahan and Amber Kistler combined for 23 points in support of Rich's outstanding performance, while freshman guard Bailey Morris dished out a game-high nine assists.

Concordia will advance to tonight's (Friday) 7 p.m. second round game for a matchup with the winner of Cardinal Stritch (Wis.) and Bethel (Ind.).

HASTINGS 57, TENN. WESLEYAN 43: SIoux CITY, Iowa — Both Hastings and Tennessee Wesleyan struggled through a low-scoring first half in which neither team shot better than 37.5 percent from the field. The Broncos warmed up just enough in the second half to pull away from the Bulldogs for a 57-43 first round victory at the State Farm-NAIA Division II Women's Basketball National Championship.

Laurel Zwienen came off the bench to score 15 points and contribute a pair of blocks in teaming with Alicia Stalter to form a potent frontcourt. The Broncos finished with a 32-18 edge in points in the paint.

Men's Hoops

PURDUE 79, NEBRASKA 61: INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Anthony Johnson scored a career-high 17 points to help Purdue defeat Nebraska 79-61 on Thursday night in the first round of the Big Ten tournament.

Terone Johnson had 16 points, six rebounds and six assists, Ryne Smith scored 15 points and Robbie Hummel added 10 points for the sixth-seeded Boilermakers (21-11).

The Boilermakers shot 56 percent from the field and made 13 3-pointers, matching a tournament record most recently reached in 2002.

Bo Spencer scored 22 points for the 11th-seeded Cornhuskers (12-18), who were playing in their first Big Ten tournament game. Nebraska finished the season on a five-game losing skid.

MINNESOTA 75, NORTHWESTERN 68: OT: INDIANAPOLIS (AP) — Andre Hollins had a career-high 25 points and Austin Hollins finished with 12, leading 10th-seeded Minnesota to a 75-68 overtime win over Northwestern in the first round of the Big Ten tournament Thursday.

The loss may end the Wildcats' slim hopes of getting an NCAA bid for the first time in school history.

JerShon Cobb scored a career-high 24 points and John Shuma had 21 points to lead seventh-seeded Northwestern (18-13). But the Wildcats made only one basket over the final 9:43.

Northwestern led 61-57 with 4:06 to play in regulation, but the Golden Gophers (19-13) tied the score on Andre Hollins' breakaway layup with 1:02 to go. Both teams missed shots that would have given them the lead in the final 10 seconds of regulation.

Minnesota scored the final six points to seal the win.

NJIT 65, HOUSTON BAPTIST 64: CHICAGO (AP) — Isaiah Wilkerson scored 20 points to help NJIT edge Houston Baptist 65-64 in the first round of the Great West Conference tournament Thursday.

The fourth-seeded Highlanders (14-16) will face top-seeded Utah Valley in the semifinals Friday.

Lynx Resume Title Chase

BROOKINGS (AP) — Allison Koehn and Heidi Hoff combined for 32 points, powering Brandon Valley to a 51-36 quarterfinal victory over Rapid City Stevens on Thursday at the South Dakota girls Class AA basketball tournament.

Koehn scored a game-high 19 points, hit three of the Lynx's six 3-pointers and grabbed 10 rebounds. Hoff added 13 points, a team-high 11 rebounds and six assists for Brandon Valley (17-7).

Katie Klapprodt and Margaret McCloud paced the Raiders (13-10) with nine points apiece. McCloud finished with a game-high 17 rebounds.

Brandon Valley shot 34 percent from the field while holding Stevens to 27.5 percent.

MITCHELL 67, R.C. CENTRAL 42: BROOKINGS (AP) — Macy Miller had 22 points and Kerri Young add 15 as Mitchell beat Rapid City Central 67-42 Thursday in the first round of the South Dakota girls Class AA basketball tournament.

The Kernels (22-1) raced out to a 41-17 halftime lead.

Mitchell shot 49 percent from the field and held The Cobblers (11-13) to just 31 percent.

Kristin Sabers added 11 points and Megan Farnham 10 for Mitchell.

Grace Weeks had 14 points and six rebounds for Rapid City Central, which had a 25-8 advantage in bench scoring.

S.F. ROOSEVELT 58, ABERDEEN CENTRAL 47: BROOKINGS (AP) — Sydney Rome had 17 points as Sioux Falls Roosevelt beat Aberdeen Central 58-47 Thursday to advance to the South Dakota girls Class AA basketball tournament semifinals.

Rome had three of the Rough Riders' six 3-pointers and went 4-for-4 from the free throw line. Roosevelt (17-7) also got 12 points and six rebounds from Lauren Kunz.

The Rough Riders were outshot from the field but made 24 of 28 free throws to Aberdeen Central's 11-for-19.

Kelsey Hannigan and Samantha Knecht led the Golden Eagles (16-8) with eight points apiece.

S.F. WASHINGTON 44, S.F. O'GORMAN 39: BROOKINGS (AP) — Ellie Benson scored 13 points and Sioux Falls Washington held off Sioux Falls O'Gorman 44-39 Thursday in the first round of the South Dakota girls Class AA basketball tournament.

Washington (19-4) led by 12 points in the third quarter, but O'Gorman cut it to two points late in the fourth quarter. Washington stole an inbound pass with 14 seconds left to ice it.

Benson was 7-for-8 from the free-throw line. Washington made 21 of 27 free throws. O'Gorman was perfect from the line but took just nine shots.

Lefty Perkins Gets \$10.3M Over 3 More Years With Twins

FORT MYERS, Fla. (AP) — Glen Perkins appeared on the outs with the Minnesota Twins in 2010, his struggles on the mound compounded by a grievance he filed against the team the previous season.

Two years later, Perkins is the one arm the Twins know they can count on in the back end of their bullpen. Minnesota and the left-handed setup man agreed Thursday to a four-year contract that adds \$10.3 million over three seasons and includes a team option for 2016.

For the first time in his career, Perkins has some level of stability and security.

"I hate using clichis, but it means I can just go out and pitch for the next four years," Perkins said. "That's all that matters now. I can just go out there and pitch. I don't have to worry about anything other than pitching. I don't have to worry about anything like my family and all those good things."

Perkins emerged as a reliable late-inning reliever last season, going 4-4 with a 2.48 ERA in 65 games. He struck out 65 and walked 21 in 61 2-3 innings.

"Everything has changed over the last couple of years," manager Ron Gardenhire said earlier this spring training. "He's content. He understands more about the game than he ever has. He understands what he wants out of the game more than he ever did before."

It was a breakout season that came as a surprise to some after a couple of injury plagued years that included 2009, when Perkins and his agent had the players' association file a grievance against the Twins for sending him to Triple-A Rochester after activating him from the disabled list in August. Perkins thought he should have remained on the major league roster and been sent on a rehab assignment instead. The grievance was later settled.

He was converted from a starter to a reliever and grabbed a role as an overpowering setup man last season. Now with closer Joe Nathan gone to Texas, Matt Capps coming off of a disappointing 2011, starter Brian Duensing moving to the bullpen from the rotation and Joel Zumaya out for the season with elbow-ligament replacement surgery, Perkins is the rock.

"He's got the perfect situation. He's living at home. He grew up a Twins fan," Gardenhire said. "Can't get any better for him and I think it took a while for him to realize how fortunate he was. That's just being in the game and seeing how other people handle it. He's done an awful lot in this game already and he's got a lot more he can do, and he realizes that, believe me. I think he really likes what he's doing."

With a healthy arm, the former University of Minnesota standout and native of Stillwater, Minn., has seen his velocity jump a little and he is comfortable this spring knowing that he has a role with the team from the start. There has even been some talk about Perkins eventually becoming the team's closer.

"I feel like where I pitched last year and where I'll pitch this year that I can impact a game as much, or more, and I'm OK with that," Perkins said earlier this spring. "I like coming into situations where a closer wouldn't typically come in. It is a cliché, but I like to help out the team, and I think I can help out the team the most, for me, this way."
