National Park Service To Ask City For Use Of Capitol Building

The National Park Service will request permission from the Yankton City Commission Monday to use the Territorial Capitol Replica building in Riverside Park as a visitor contact center during the summer.
Park staff would not only distribute information about the Missouri National Recreational River and Yankton, but also lead guided tours of Riverside Park and the Meridian Bridge. Other tours could be developed of the downtown and historic home district.

The proposed hours of operation would be 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday from May 26 through Aug. 17.
Other items on Monday's agenda include allowing the use of Riverside Park for camping during the South Dakota Kayak Challenge, a request for a liquor license incentive and a bid award for janitorial services at the Summit Activities Center.
The meeting gets under way at 7 p.m. in the City of Yankton Meeting Room, located at the Technical Education Center, 1200 W. 21st St.

RiverWalk Offers Preview Of 2012 Sculptures During Benefit March 16

RiverWalk will raise funds for public art by bartending at the Marketplace Cafe on Friday, March 16. All tips from 5-8 p.m. will be used to fund 13 new sculptures.
Photos of the new sculptures will be available for viewing on that evening only. "We are proud of the new sculptures which will soon be on the streets of downtown and want to offer a sneak-peak before installation in May," says Lisa Scheve, president of the RiverWalk board.
