Komen Race Leaving Vermillion For Sioux Falls

SIOUX FALLS — The South Dakota Affiliate of Susan G. Komen® is moving its 2012 Race for the Cure from the DakotaDome in Vermillion to downtown Sioux Falls on Sept. 30.

Organizers believe the new location will enable more supporters from across the state to attend the event. The South Dakota affiliate's desire is to grow the race, because more money raised translates into better breast health and greater progress towards a cure for breast cancer.

"We are deeply grateful to the people of Vermillion for propelling the Komen Race for the Cure from infancy into a gathering of more than 4,000 participants," says Colette Abbott, founder and former race chair for the Susan G. Komen South Dakota Race for the Cure. "I've been amazed at the commitment of South Dakotans to raise more than \$800,000 to fund breast cancer research and education since 2008. The impact of the Race for the Cure on breast health in our state is only poised to grow as the race moves to Sioux Falls and becomes a truly statewide race."

Seventy-five percent of the funds raised through the race will stay in South Dakota for breast health education, breast cancer screening, treatment programs and research to prevent, treat and cure breast cancer. The remaining 25 percent supports groundbreaking breast cancer research on a national level.

The tentative starting point for the race is the intersection of Phillips Ave. and 2nd Street. The 5K and one-mile race routes will continue throughout the downtown area.

75 YEARS AGO
Friday, March 12, 1937
• The ice gorge in the Missouri river above Yankton starting around noon Wednesday morning, went out last evening, releasing a closely packed mass of heavy ice which passed Yankton without incident and went on down stream.
• Participation in half a dozen phases of the federal social security and relief programs will cost South Dakota taxpayers nearly \$4,500,000 in the next two fiscal years, if all laws enacted on that subject by the 1937 legislature are put into effect. This does not include the unemployment insurance plan, which is not financed by general taxation, but which will cost employers an estimated \$300,000 to \$400,000 a year.

50 YEARS AGO
Monday, March 12, 1962
• The miserable month of March added a new twist to a four-week pattern of weekend storms as blizzard conditions this morning provided a climax to three days of snow and slush.

25 YEARS AGO
Thursday, March 12, 1987
• South Dakota's director of natural resources says Nebraska should be talking to his department about possible low-level nuclear radioactive waste disposal sites in northeast Nebraska. John Smith, director of the natural resources department since June, said he was not assuming that the sites would be dangerous to South Dakota, but that as a matter of courtesy Nebraska should have kept the state informed. "If they think they are going to select a site that impacts South Dakota, they better think again." One potential site is 20 miles southeast of Yankton in Cedar County and another is 40 miles southwest in Knox County.
• Amy Schumacher's essay about the nation's first president, George Washington, has earned her a first in Yankton, first in South Dakota and first in the division. The 7th grader at Yankton Middle School is aiming now for a national first in the 1987 American History Essay Contest sponsored by the National Society of the Daughter's of the American Revolution. Amy states "I really like history class. Miss Florence Kriebell is my teacher. She makes history fun and interesting for everybody."

Grassfire Battled In Knox County

Firefighters from three towns battled a grassfire that threatened two farms in Knox County Sunday afternoon.

Yankton firefighters were summoned at approximately 3 p.m. with the report of a grassfire, located six miles southeast of Bruno's in South Yankton, Neb. The fire was burning through a combination of pastureland, a cornfield, hillsides and trees.

Firefighters from Wynot, Neb., were also summoned, and a fire crew from Fordyce, Neb., was also called in to contain the blaze, which was burning on both sides of the road and threatening two farms.

Crews were on the scene for about 2 1/2 hours containing the blaze, which was estimated to blacken about 250 to 300 acres.

The fire was believed to have started in a pile of trees, but it was unknown how it started since no controlled burning was going on and the owners of the land were not at home at the time.

Sunday's blaze was one of several fires reported in the area during the weekend, as warm temperatures, brisk winds and dormant vegetation produced tinderbox conditions.

Rain began falling in Yankton at approximately 7 p.m. Sunday night, temporarily alleviating the dry conditions.

More rain is expected early today (Monday) before giving way to sunshine and more warm weather. Temperatures are forecast to climb into the upper 60s to upper 70s for the rest of the week.
