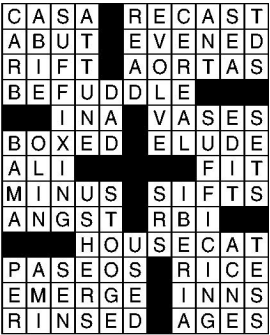
Cops: Clerk Saw Stolen Card Was Her Mom's

LANCASTER, Pa. (AP) — Police say a teen fraudster's cunning credit card plot was foiled by a Pennsylvania convenience store clerk who noticed her own mother's name on the card. Manor Township police say the clerk also recognized the teen as a former classmate when he tried to use the card to buy gas early Tuesday morning. Authorities say 19-year-old Joshua Devonshire fled but was spotted later apparently trying to put the stolen card back in the clerk's mother's car. He was eventually taken into custody after being spotted sleeping in a car in the same development. Investigators say they recovered several items from the car that were suspected to be stolen. Devonshire is being held on \$3,000 bail. It wasn't immediately clear whether he had an attorney.

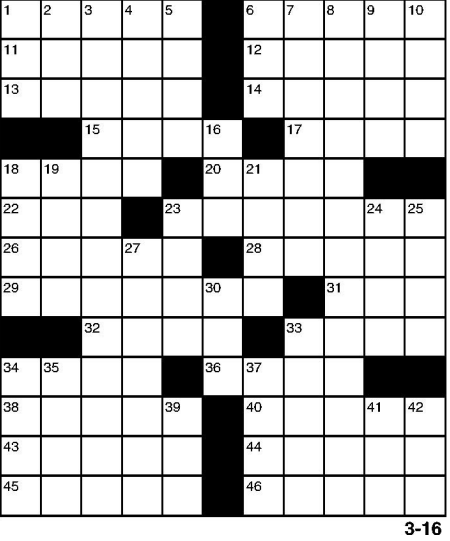

Marie leads by example, according to Parkston girls basketball coach Rob VanLaecken. "Marie has proven her sportsmanship and leadership throughout the six years at Parkston High School as our leader on the floor and off the floor, and is captain of the team," he told the *Press & Dakotan*. "Marie is one of the most respectful and well-mannered individuals I have ever been associated with in the school setting. She is very dedicated and a determined individual." During the recently concluded season, Malloy proved her athletic ability by leading the team on both ends of the court. On offense, she averaged 22.5 points, 9 rebounds and 5 assists per game. On defense, she averaged 9 rebounds and 4 steals. "She is one of the best defenders in the state and one of the quickest guards to play the game," VanLaecken said. However, Malloy doesn't focus solely on herself and her game as she reaches out to others, the coach said. "Marie has helped out with our little kids' Saturday morning basketball clinics for kindergarten through sixth grades," he said. "She's a positive role model for our youth in Parkston." VanLaecken, who has amassed the most coaching wins in South Dakota high school girls basketball history, said he was privileged to mentor Malloy. "It is every coach's dream to have a student/athlete of Marie's manner, talents and work ethic on his or her team. She is the kind of athlete that makes everyone around her better," he said. "I'm very glad that I got to coach her for the last six years. She is not only a great athlete and basketball player but also an outstanding young lady." Malloy has built a stellar resume during high school. Her achievements include Student Council president for 2011-12, homecoming royalty in 2011, TORCH (Teens on the Road to Chemical Health) member for four years, Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA) member for six years, National Honor Society for three years and Future Business Leaders of America (FBLA) member for three years. In the athletic arena, Malloy has won 21 letters in varsity sports at Parkston High School. She has also competed on the Parkston swim team. She was a five-year starter in basketball and became the steals leader and second all-time leading scorer for Parkston girls basketball. She was a Wendy's High School Heisman and McDonald's All-American nominee, as well as a National Girls and Women in Sports recipient. Malloy earned Class "A" All-State basketball honors two years and won a number of conference and team honors. She was a state cross country qualifier for four years and won the 2010 Most Positive Attitude and 2006 Most Improved Runner awards on her team. In track, Malloy won the state long jump in 2010, took second place in 2011 and was fifth in 2009. She was named the team's most valuable sprinter in 2010 and the team's most valuable athlete in field events for two years. She was a state qualifier in the 100-meter dash for two years and the 400-meter relay for three years, the 800-meter relay for five years, the 1,600-meter relay for three years and the 3,200-meter relay for one year. In volleyball, she collected the most team assists in 2010. The long list of accomplishments shows Malloy's worthiness of the Spirit of Su, VanLaecken said. "I was so very happy for Marie because it is well deserved," he said of the award. "I'm just glad the state of South Dakota has gotten to see her play and see the kind of young lady she is. I think it says a lot about her, her family and the community of Parkston."
