Petition Deadline Approaching For Those Running For Office

PIERRE — Secretary of State Jason Gant is reminding people interested in running for office that petitions for political party candidates are due by 5 p.m. on Tuesday, March 27.

"As of 5 p.m. (March 12), we've had 21 candidates for State Senate, 49 candidates for State House, and 320 candidates for various county offices turn in petitions."

"We are currently only two weeks away from the deadline when petitions are due. Petitions must be personally delivered or mailed via REGISTERED MAIL no later than 5 p.m. on the 27th of March," Gant said.

"I want to remind candidates that if they choose to mail petitions close to the deadline that under state law, they must use registered mail. Certified mail or regular first class mail is not suitable for this purpose to guarantee delivery to this office. It is heartbreaking to see candidates mistakenly send petitions in certified mail at the last minute, only to have their petitions rejected for that reason."

"Petitions may be circulated for the U.S. House of Representatives, all 105 Legislators (35 Senate and 70 House seats), County Commissioners, County Treasurer, County State's Attorney, County Coroner, and delegates to both the Republican and Democrat state conventions," Gant said. "With two weeks to go, candidates are starting to run short on time to collect and turn in petitions. Once March 27th passes, it is too late."

Independent candidates may still continue to gather signatures for an extended period of time. Secretary Gant noted "Independent candidates for these offices have until 5 p.m. Tuesday, June 5, at 5 p.m. to turn in petitions for the same offices."

Gant noted, "We have announced the candidates who have successfully submitted their petitions to our office on our facebook page at <http://www.facebook.com/SOS-Gant>. A listing of all candidates for office — county and state — may be found on our website at <http://sdsos.gov/elections>."

Yankton Receives Lower ISO Rating, Could See Lower Insurance Premiums

The Insurance Services Office (ISO) has lowered the Public Protection Classification (PPC) ratings for the City of Yankton and the Yankton Fire Protection District, which could lead to lower insurance premiums for homes and businesses.

A PPC survey of the City of Yankton and the Yankton Fire Protection District was recently completed. The survey analyzes the structural fire suppression delivery system for these areas.

It re-classified the rating for the City of Yankton and the Yankton Fire Protection District from a "5/10" to a "3/8b." These ratings take effect April 1.

ISO's Public Protection Classification program evaluates communities according to a uniform set of criteria which includes needed fire flows, receiving and handling fire alarms, the fire department and the water supply.

Insurance companies use PPC information for marketing, underwriting and to help establish fair premiums for homeowners and commercial fire insurance.

In 2011, there were 779 ISO rated areas in South Dakota.

With the new rating, Yankton is now one of four areas that have a "3" rating. No communities in South Dakota currently hold a class 1 or 2 rating.

The following major features are evaluated during the survey:

- Fire Alarm and Communication System — This review accounts for 10 percent of the total classification and centers upon a community's facilities and support for handling and dispatching fire alarms.
- Fire Department — This review accounts for 50 percent of the total classification and focuses upon items such as engine companies, distribution on fire stations, department manning and training.
- Water Supply System — This review accounts for 40 percent of the total classification. For Yankton, the highest marks on the survey were given for the water supply, and the inspection and condition of the fire hydrants.

A PPC rating of "3" applies to homes and businesses that are within five road miles of the fire station and within 1,000 feet of a hydrant.

The PPC rating of "8b" applies to properties beyond 1,000 feet from a hydrant but still within five road miles of the fire station.

Any property beyond five road miles of a fire station and not within 1,000 feet of a fire hydrant would continue to be rated a "10."

Not all, but most insurance companies base their premiums on the ISO's Public Protection Classification.
