It can be said that the Bereans were careful how they listened. Here is Paul who is famous and a spiritual giant. The Bereans did not just accept everything he said. They went to the scriptures to see if it was true.

Jesus wanted people to think. He instructed them to count the cost. He used parables that created mystery, which led to thinking. His teachings required a thought process. We are a society that listens. We lis-

ten to a lot of different voices: politics, health, cooking, self help, religion, etc. But are we careful how we listen and who we're listening to? Do we think and compare it to what the Bible says? I challenge you to be careful how you listen. Don't accept something just because you're affiliated with a certain group.

After giving the statement, "consider carefully how you listen," Jesus ended it with, "whoever has will be given more; whoever doesn't have, even what he THINKS he has will be taken from him." God doesn't want you to live in a delusion. Make certain what you take into your heart lines up with the Bible. Be of noble character.

- Tuesday and Thursday — Crafty Splashy Day. Craft fun in the morning and a trip to the pool in the afternoon. (Families

need to buy a pool pass for their child at Memorial Park Pool)

• Wednesday — Worship Day. A short worship service at 9 a.m. each Wednesday in which we sing, read and listen to the stories of the Bible. Families are invited to attend any of the services.

• Friday — Field Trip Day: Travel both locally and regionally on some educational and fun trips. Children will be bused on our church bus by a qualified bus driver.

CKC will also be transporting the kids to swimming lessons at the Memorial Park pool every morning from June 4-15. There is a fee payable to the Yankton Park and Rec. Money and registrations are due to the church by May 15.

Calvary Kids Club applications can be picked up at Calvary Baptist Church at 2407 Broadway. The application fee includes a T-shirt for your child.

The staff is highly qualified. Many are educators and paraprofessionals in the Yankton area.

Children are admitted on a first-come basis with a total of 40 children enrolled.

Yankton College Announces Continuing Education Course For Pastors, Lay Leaders

Yankton College, in partnership with Eden Theological Seminary, will offer a pastoral theology course for pastors and lay leaders as part of the Associate degree program at Yankton College. The title of the course is "Faith Formation — Connecting Church and Home: Generation to Generation," and it will be taught by Dr. Diane E. Shallue, Director of Christian Education and Small Group Ministries at University Lutheran Church of Hope in Minneapolis.

This course will explore the strengths and challenges involved in intergenerational learning in congregations and provide skills in using this approach. This course will delve into six basic models of intergenerational learning and explore the four basic patterns of intergenerational planning. Methods for implementing this type of ministry in a congregation will be emphasized. Participants will develop strategies to help parents and grandparents as well as other adults pass along the faith at home and at church and leave equipped to nurture the faith of all ages by bringing the generations together at church and at home.

The first meeting of the class will be May 4-5, and the classes will meet online weekly through June 1. There is a cost for both a credit and an audit. Limited scholarships are available. Students will participate in the Leadership Continuing Education Event for the first class meeting.

The Leadership Continuing Education Event will be held May 4 (1-9 p.m.) and May 5 (8:30 a.m.-noon) at the Chamberlain United Church of Christ, Chamberlain.

The Leadership Continuing Education Event will focus on leadership in Intergenerational Ministries and how to create an intergenerational perspective in a congregation. Models of intergenerational ministry and examples from the personal experience of the presenter as a congregational religious educator will be provided. There is a cost to attend just the Leadership Continuing Education Event. Costs include dinner on Friday, continental breakfast on Saturday, instruction and materials.

Both the Course and the Event will be coordinated by the Rev. Dr. Anita Bradshaw, who also serves as the director for Eden's Judiciary Based Education initiatives, including its partnership in the Yankton College Pastoral Theology program. Dr. Bradshaw has served local congregations as well as faculty at a number of colleges and seminaries.
