and has expanded the state's tax base, according to Owen.

"I think we are obligated to show there has been a good return for the refund program that is there," he said. "I think if we could put the refunds in context of the growth in tax base, jobs and making South Dakota's economy grow, that's going to be the first line of defense.'

Owen said South Dakota has a competitive tax environment except when it comes to the contractors' excise tax coupled with sales and use taxes.

"We've used refunds for a long time to kind of soften that blow, because people spending \$500 million pay a tax of \$40-plus million and can spend those dollars in other places," he stated. "I think some kind of incentive that addresses that issue is going to be essential.'

Should House Bill 1234 be referred to the November ballot, Owen said he does not know if the Chamber will take a position. When Daugaard's education bill made its way through the Legislature, Owen said the organization testified in favor of the merit and bonus pay components of it.

"I think the governor deserves credit for trying to bring some reform to education that matches it up with things that succeed in the economy elsewhere," he

Owen said he is surprised that the South Dakota Education Association is determined to

refer the law. "Given the changes in the bill (between the time it was introduced and passed), the late implementation date and the fact that schools are trying to be part of a partnership to increase taxes, I was surprised they wanted to divide their focus and effort by putting this on the ballot. But they are very, very upset

at these reforms. As far as the aforementioned Initiated Measure 15, which would raise the state sales tax by 1 percent to fund schools and Medicaid. Owen said the Cham-

ber is skeptical.

"We are concerned about the part of the law that would sequester 20 percent of the general fund to be used for schools on top of growth that would come given the law that says we increase the state aid formula for schools by inflation or 3 percent, whichever is less," he stated. "Sequestering that much of the general fund long term, I think, is going to cause problems. We would probably caution people that, if not the year after this passes, at some point you're going to have to look at loosening some of those restrictions. It's too much money to be set
