Knox County Escapee Captured Thursday

CENTER, Neb. - A Sioux Falls man who escaped from a Knox County, Neb., jail Thursday morning was captured after a brief chase by car and on foot.

According to a press release issued Friday from Knox County Sheriff Don Henery, Michael James Sigsbee, 32, escaped from the exercise yard of the county jail in Center, Neb., at 9:06 a.m. Thursday.

Last

County law enforcement chased Sigsbee, who was being held on a theft charge and was wanted in Iowa on felony charges, on foot until he gained access to a 1994 Toyota owned by David and Jane Davidson of Center. Sigsbee drove at a high speed toward a Knox County deputy, who fired on the vehicle and deflated a front tire. Sigsbee drove the vehicle two miles south and approximately threequarter miles east of Center, then crashed through a steel pasture gate before stopping. He then took off on foot.

The sheriff and a deputy eventually captured Sigsbee about onehalf mile southeast of where he abandoned the Toyota. Sigsbee was then transported back to the county jail.

The Nebraska State Patrol investigated the incident because shots were fired by county law enforcement.

Police officers from Bloomfield, Creighton, Niobrara and Santee were also involved in the search.
