their families requested and received Bon Homme High School diplomas. They were Richard A. Mennis of San Diego; Russell Hamilton of Avon; the late John (Jack) Lee Beringer; and Herbert Gottschalk of Minnesota. They represented a variety of military branches, combat area, and awards and commendations.

Besides the five Bon Homme graduates, an honorary diploma was previously awarded to a Scotland graduate under the state law, Beringer said.

For the five newest "alumni," Beringer contacted Bon Homme superintendent Bryce Knudson about securing diplomas.

Knudson enthusiastically embraced the effort, expressing pride in his own family's military service.

"These honorary diplomas have special meaning to me because I have two daughters and a son-in-law in the military," he said, adding that one daughter has served in Afghanistan.

Beringer expected a certificate for the veterans, but Knudson secured the same diplomas awarded to high school seniors.

"It's not just a piece of paper, it's a nice booklet," Beringer said. "It's leather bound, and it has some quality and meaning to it. Bryce came in and showed it to me. In my opinion, I thought it looked great."

Four diplomas were presented to veterans or representatives at the January school board meeting, and the fifth diploma was awarded at the February board meeting.

Command Sgt. Major George

Arends with the South Dakota Department of Veterans Affairs attended the January meeting and assisted Beringer with the presentation.

Varilek said he was overwhelmed at the short ceremony. "I got goose bumps from it and knew it couldn't be any better than this," he said.

He wasn't the only person struck by emotion at the ceremony.

"I was excited by (the idea), but it didn't hit me until I walked into the school board meeting," Beringer said. "I accepted the diploma (for my family member). It was a very proud moment."

Knudson agreed. "My school board was blown away by this (presentation). When we presented the diplomas, there were hugs and handshakes. It was a wonderful thing to do," he said.

At the board meetings, Beringer talked about the background of the honorary diplomas and the service records of the honored veterans.

Varilek received his diploma at the January board meeting and couldn't contain his pleasure.

"You should have seen Stan, he was just beaming," Beringer said. "At the presentation, George (Arends) said, 'There's a man that's really proud.'"

The celebration was just beginning, as Varilek's family threw him a surprise graduation party at his home after the ceremony.

"All eight of my children went to Bon Homme High School, and this (diploma) is really important to me," he said. "Then, I looked at my diploma (just prior to the Press & Dakotan interview) and saw it was dated November 11, 2012. Holy smokes! I have a diploma that's dated Veterans Day! It means even more to me now."

Now that Varilek has a diploma,

he deserves a formal commencement ceremony, Knudson said.

"Our (Bon Homme) senior class would like Stan to be part of their graduation in May," he said.

Varilek's lifetime achievements send a powerful message to today's students, Knudson said.

"Our students see the importance of serving in the military. These kids have heard and read about it, and now they can see and talk about it," he said.

"It lends credence to the importance of serving in the military. A number of our students pursue the military, and we're so proud of it."

The honorary diplomas provide a small way of saying thanks to veterans who sacrificed their education in order to serve their country, Knudson said.

"I think it's a wonderful program, and a wonderful opportunity for the veterans," he said. "It's good for the school district, also, to have these veterans as Bon Homme High School graduates. It makes all of us proud — the students, teachers, staff and district office."

Beringer credited the school district with its full cooperation in making the honorary diplomas not only possible but also highly respected.

Varilek hopes that the publicity surrounding the five Bon Homme "graduates" will encourage other veterans to pursue their own diplomas, regardless of their age.

"For other veterans who are in the same shape that I was, I say, 'Go for it, guys! We've earned it!'"

of the caucus after accusing Lust and other House GOP leaders of ethics violations.

The Building South Dakota bill now heads back to the Senate, where it likely will be referred to a negotiating committee that will try to work out differences between the House- and Senate-passed versions.

South Dakota currently has no incentive plan because a previous program that refunded construction taxes for large industrial projects was allowed to expire Dec. 31. Voters in November rejected a replacement plan suggested by Gov. Dennis Daugaard.

Supporters of the comprehensive measure say South Dakota often loses out to other states on large projects because of its upfront tax structure. The new plan would refund part or all of the state sales tax paid by projects of more than \$20 million that would not have located in South Dakota without such an incentive.

Contractors' excise tax collected on those projects would be placed in the Building South Dakota Fund so the state can reinvest in future projects. The new fund also would get a portion of unclaimed property the state receives from abandoned bank accounts.

House Democratic Leader Bernie Hunhoff of Yankton called the plan a strong bipartisan compromise with more accountability and transparency.
