The Class B boys' team, coached by MMC's Ted Quinn, includes Andrew Hora of Viborg-Hurley. The Class A boys' team, coached by DWU's Tim Weidenbach, includes Brock Leifer of Elk Point-Jefferson and Blake Van Ginkel of Dakota Valley. The Class AA boys' team will be coached by Justin Heckenlaible of Minnesota West Community College.

Eide, Waytashek Earn Summit Honors

ELMHURST, Ill. — South Dakota State University's Ashley Eide and Megan Waytashek have been named to the Academic All-Summit League Women's Basketball Team as voted on by the nine member-institution's faculty athletics representatives and sports information directors.

Eide and Waytashek were two of the five players selected to the elite honor squad, and were joined by Omaha's Paige Frauendorfer, Fort Wayne's Amanda Hyde and Kansas City's Elisse O'Connor. All five honorees were also members of the all-Summit League First Team for their efforts on the playing floor. In addition, Eide (second team), Hyde (second team) and Frauendorfer (third team) were selected as Capital One Academic All-Americans earlier this season. A senior from Sioux Falls, Eide carries a 3.97 grade point average while majoring in health, physical education and recreation. She currently leads the Jackrabbits with an average of 13.9 points per game, while also averaging 3.8 rebounds and 2.4 assists. Waytashek, a sophomore from Lino Lakes, Minn., has posted a 3.96 GPA as a mechanical engineering major. She ranks second on the squad with 13.8 points per game, twice reaching the 30-point mark in a game this season and earning Summit League Player of the Week honors three times. South Dakota State, 25-7 overall, won both the Summit League regular season and postseason tournament titles during the 2012-13 season and will make its fifth consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament this weekend. The Jackrabbits face fourth-seeded South Carolina in first-round action Saturday afternoon in Boulder, Colo.

SDSU Puts Two On Men's Academic All-League Team

ELMHURST, Ill. — Summit League champion South Dakota State had two players selected to the five-member Summit League Academic All-League Team for men's basketball, as voted by the Faculty Athletic Representatives and Sports Information Directors of the league's nine member institutions. Student-athletes were chosen for the honor based on their academic and athletic performances this season. Tournament champion South Dakota State led the way with two selections in guard Brayden Carlson and forward Jordan Dykstra. Joining the duo are Oakland's Travis Bader, Western Illinois' Jack Hout and Omaha's John Karhoff. Carlson, Dykstra and Karhoff each earned Capital One Academic All-District selections in February. Bader (1st team) and Dykstra (2nd team) were named All-Summit League. Carlson, who has a 3.924 GPA in business economics, started all 34 games to date for South Dakota State. He is averaging 8.7 points per game and ranks third on the team with 1.4 three-pointers per contest. In an early season game against Marshall, Carlson scored a career-high 23 points and equaled his career-best with five three-pointers. Dykstra, with a 3.68 GPA in biology/pre-dentistry, ranks third in The Summit League in both rebounding (7.9 pp) and three-point field goal percentage (.430). He has started all 34 games for the Jackrabbits and ranks second on the team with 12.5 points per game. To be eligible for the Academic All-League team, a student-athlete must have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.30 (on a 4.0 scale), completed at least one full academic year at the current institution and participated in 50 percent of their team's competitions.
