Yankton UCC Presents 'Great Hymns Of The Church' Sunday

Everyone who has ever loved a hymn will be inspired by this year's annual Palm Sunday concert at the Yankton United Church of Christ (Congregational).

The church's 45-voice Adult Choir — supported by an array of talented area instrumentalists — will present "Great Hymns of the Church" at 4 p.m. Sunday, March 24, in the historic sanctuary at Fifth & Walnut.

The public is warmly invited to attend both the free concert (an offering will be gathered to help defray expenses) and a reception afterwards in the church's Pilgrim Hall. (The sanctuary and fellowship hall are both accessible via elevator.)

Adult choir director Jennifer Powell, said, "We are so excited by this concert because we know everyone will hear hymns they know and love. We invite everyone to come experience a wide range of favorite hymns in settings by some of the most well-known choral arrangers of our day."

The dozen hymns to be presented by the choir include three with congregational participation — "Crown Him with Many Crowns" and "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee," both accompanied by brass and organ, and "Lift Up Your Heads, O Mighty Gates," accompanied by organ and the UCC Youth Handbell Choir.

The handbells will also be playing "Palm Sunday Glory," an arrangement of three traditional Palm Sunday hymns. Members of the group are Brenna Becker, Gage Becker, Emma Christensen, Allyssa Hagen, Hope Leshner, Story Leshner, and Felicia Somers, assisted by Eileen Leshner, and under the direction of Pam Kettering.

The remainder of the evening's choral program features hymns from the traditional to the contemporary, the exultant to the somber.

Among the upbeat pieces will be "Come, Now Is the Time to Worship," accompanied by piano, bass guitar, and trap set; the a cappella spiritual, "I'm Gonna Sing!"; and the rollicking traditional chorus, "Give Me Oil in My Lamp."

Three well-known hymns of the church will be sung in powerfully quiet arrangements — "Be Thou My Vision," with its traditional Irish melody; "Fairest Lord Jesus," with a lovely new tune supporting the 17th-century words; and a stunning

arrangement of "Steal Away" for choir, piano, and soprano saxophone.

Jennifer Powell noted, "We had to choose some quiet pieces, not only because they are beautiful and so appropriate for Holy Week, but also because our singers need an occasional break from high notes and double forte dynamics!"

Three other traditional hymns have been arranged in an unexpectedly triumphant style that emphasizes the power of faith. "Abide With Me" and "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" begin in quiet, but build to exciting Amens. And sure to be a favorite of all in attendance, an exciting arrangement of "How Great Thou Art" will be accompanied by piano and brass.

Ted Powell, the Yankton UCC's director of music and organist/pianist, will be joined in accompanying the singers not just by the UCC Youth Handbell Choir, but also by a select group of area instrumentalists.

Playing the soprano saxophone solo for "Steal Away" will be ReNae Jackson, Yankton Middle School band director. "Come, Now Is the Time to Worship" will be accompanied by Ted Powell on piano, Yankton native Paul Ridgway on bass guitar, and area percussion specialist Mike Benton on the trap set.

The brass quintet heard throughout the concert will include trumpeters Scott Olson, Mission Hill, principal trumpet in the South Dakota Symphony, among other professional positions, and Kevin McLouth, Tyndall, Bon Homme School band director; horn player Dr. Gary Reeves, Vermillion, of the University of South Dakota faculty; trombonist Meghan Powell, Gayville, Gayville-Volin band director; and playing the tuba, Joshua Calkin, who teaches bands and low brass at Wayne State College, Wayne, Neb.

Jennifer Powell says, "We hope this concert will be a fitting way for all of us to begin our Holy Week observances, as we are reminded of our faith by the words and music of some of the church's great hymns."
