Mitchell's Rietveld To Join MMC Track, Cross Country Programs

Mitchell High School standout Berkley Rietveld will attend Mount Marty College and compete in track and cross country for the Lancers, the institution announced on Tuesday.

Rietveld was awarded the Hustle Award and was named Most Dedicated for cross country at Mitchell High School. She also anchored the medley relay and 3200 relay to sixth place finishes at the 2012 State Track meet. Rietveld also competed in the State Cross Country meet.

"Berkley is a great talent and we are very fortunate to have her joining the program next year," said MMC track and cross country coach Randy Fischer.

The daughter of Terry and Fran Rietveld of Mitchell, Berkley plans to major in nursing at Mount Marty College. In addition to her track and cross country awards she is also receiving an academic excellence scholarship.

Iowa Baseball Standout Headed To MMC

Danny Smith of Oyens, Iowa, will attend Mount Marty College this fall and participate in the baseball program, according to an announcement from the institution.

Smith, a 6-4 left-handed pitcher, first baseman, and outfielder at Remsen-Union High School, heads into his senior year already earning three varsity letters in baseball. Last summer, Smith was named 1st Team All-Conference with a 4-4 record and 2 saves as a pitcher with a 2.41 earned run average. He also allowed only 37 hits in 58 innings while striking out 124 batters. Smith recorded at least 10 strikeouts in each game that he started as a pitcher and excelled on offense recording 24 hits with 15 runs, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 4 home runs, and 14 runs batted in while batting .296. His sophomore year was equally as impressive with a 5-2 record as a pitcher with a 3.21 earned run average and struck out 55 batters in 48 innings. Offensively, he bat-

ted .293 while recording 7 doubles. "This is a great signing for the baseball program," said MMC baseball coach Andy Bernatow. "We are in need of pitching, especially left-handed pitching. Danny has the potential to be a power arm for us and his ceiling is really high as a pitcher. He has also been really productive offensively. Over the years Mount Marty has done well with players that can play a position and pitch and we're going to give Danny an opportunity to do both.

Assistant coach Jason Nelson first saw Nelson at a try-out camp in Akron, Iowa. "We both walked away very impressed with his ability level," Bernatow said. "Danny attended our pitching camp this past February and we again were very impressed. He has the potential to provide an immediate impact for us at the varsity level. I am eager for Danny to get to campus and excited that he is going to be a Lancer."

The son of Steve and Shari Smith, Danny Smith will major in recreational management at Mount Marty College. Smith will receive an academic incentive scholarship in addition to his baseball award at Mount Marty.

USD's Pavlovic Named Summit League Tennis Player Of Week

VERMILLION — University of South Dakota first-year tennis player Milica Pavlovic has been named Summit League Tennis Player of the Week as announced Tuesday by the league office. It is the first such honor for

Pavlovic, who plays No. 1 singles and No. 1 doubles for the Coyotes (12-7).

Pavlovic combined for four wins in leading South Dakota to victories against Valparaiso and Green Bay Saturday. She beat Valpo's Kristin Zakiewicz 6-3, 6-0 and rallied from a set down to top Amanda Timm of Green Bay 2-6, 6-1, 6-1. She teamed with Maria Tortosa to score 8-2 and 9-7 wins in the top doubles spot.

Pavlovic earned her 10th singles victory of the season and moved to 9-7 as a tandem with Tortosa. South Dakota takes a five-match win streak into Summit League play which begins Friday in Oakland, Mich.

USD's Glisler Earns Summit League Track & Field Honors

VERMILLION — South Dakota high jumper Megan Glisler earned her first Summit League Women's Outdoor Track and Field Athlete of the Week honor after a school record performance at the Arizona State Invitational on Saturday night.

The junior from Sergeant Bluff, Iowa won the event with a jump of 6 feet, breaking the previous USD outdoor record of 5-9 1/4 set by Tonya Kneff in 2001. Glisler's mark is currently tied for first in the nation and leads the Summit League by 6 1/4 inches.

South Dakota track will be at two meets this week, with the Texas Relays in Austin lasting from Wednesday to Saturday and the Razorback Spring Invitational taking place

on Saturday in Fayetteville, Ark.
