Favorite pastimes of Frank and Evelyn were frequent trips to "The Hill," Ft. Randall Casino, where they made new friends and visited with their friends and neighbors while there. Evelyn and Frank enjoyed many trips with Eugene through the years touring South Dakota, Wyoming, Nebraska, Minnesota, and Iowa. They also enjoyed traveling to many states and sight-seeing as they visited with their son, Charlie, and his family in Pocatello, ID and their daughter, Elaine, and her family in Chicago, IL, Jackson, MI, and Winona, MN. Unfortunately they were unable to visit the Southwest where Elaine now lives. Daugaard Announces \$24,000 for Landfill Manager Certification Course

PIERRE — Gov. Dennis Daugaard announced that the South Dakota Board of Water and Natural Resources has approved a \$24,000 grant from the Solid Waste Management Program to the South Dakota Solid Waste Management Association to conduct a national certification course this fall for landfill managers and operators from across the state.

"It's imperative to have South Dakota landfill managers and operators adequately trained and certified to ensure the proper handling and disposal of solid waste," the governor said. "This training is important because certified landfill workers can better operate their landfills, improve protection of the environment, and save for their customers by improving landfill efficiency."

The South Dakota Solid Waste Management Association is proposing to host Manager of Landfill Operations (MOL) training in October. The course will certify new landfill

managers, maintain existing certifications, and train new employees in the solid-waste industry.

The Manager of Landfill Operations course was last held in October 2010. The grant funds will help to defray registration costs for South Dakota residents who attend.

The South Dakota Solid Waste Management Association is made up of professionals in the solid-waste industry.

The total estimated cost to prepare and conduct the course is \$37,200.

The Solid Waste Management Program provides grants and loans for solid waste disposal, recycling, and waste tire projects statewide. Revenues come from dedicated state solid waste fees that are deposited in the state Water and Environment Fund. The Legislature appropriates Water and Environment Funds annually to the Solid Waste Management Program through the governor's Omnibus Water Funding Bill.

USD Wellness Center Receives 2013 Award

VERMILION — The University of South Dakota Wellness Center was recently named as one of the nation's Outstanding Sports Facilities (OSF) by NIRSA: Leaders in Collegiate Recreation (<http://www.nirsa.org>).

The USD Wellness Center is one of 13 recipients of an OSF Award, which was presented at the NIRSA Annual Conference and Recreational Exposition earlier this month in Las Vegas, Nev. Each winner, according to NIRSA, is considered a model by which other collegiate recreational facilities should be measured and from which others can benefit. NIRSA began presenting annual OSF awards for creative, innovative designs of new or expanded facilities in 1988.

NIRSA member institutions with construction projects no more than two years old, with a facility of more than 20,000 square feet, and total construction costs of at least \$2 million are eligible for an OSF Award. The 61,000-square-foot USD Wellness Center, which opened on Jan. 17, 2011 and serves as a recreation hub for USD students and the city of Vermillion, is home to USD intramural sports, and features racquetball courts, courts for basketball and volleyball, state-of-the-art workout and training equipment, a climbing wall that stands 38-feet tall, and fitness studios.

SDDOT Launches 511 Traveler Info App

PIERRE — The South Dakota Department of Transportation has released a traveler information app for smart phones using the Android operating system and plans to do the same later for iPhones.

The South Dakota 511 mobile application provides the same information as SDDOT's popular SafeTravelUSA website, but in a compatible format with mobile phones. Current information on road conditions, highway closures, travel advisories, construction projects and incidents affecting travel is available on all interstate, U.S., and state highways.

As users move through the highway network, the app displays their locations on the state map. The map also indicates the location of SDDOT's roadside cameras and allows users to view the camera images.

The South Dakota Department of Transportation also maintains a Twitter feed that is accessible through the mobile application's main menu. In addition, the mobile app links surrounding states' mobile applications and websites.

The app is free. Users can download it from the Google Play app store by searching for "SDDOT 511", directly accessing the app at <https://play.google.com/store/search?q=SDDOT+511&cat=apps> or by scanning the QR code below.

SDDOT will release the South Dakota 511 app for iPhone devices later this year, in advance of the next winter season.

AG Urges Help To Stop Sweepstake Scams

PIERRE — South Dakota Attorney General Marty Jackley is asking consumers statewide to reach out to their elderly family, friends or neighbors, to warn them of the dangers of sweepstake scams.

The Attorney General's Consumer Protection Division has had several victims come forward to file formal complaints against these types of telemarketers. One senior wired \$2,000 and attempted to wire an additional \$1,800 before family members were able to stop the last transaction. In a separate case, an individual wired \$1,000 and attempted to wire an additional \$1,300, but a bank employee recognized the scam and was able to contact family. The Consumer Protection Division has also been working with an individual who has been harassed by a sweepstake telemarketer for 2 years with the promise of a \$15 million dollar jackpot. The last attempt was an \$11,000 transaction to cover additional taxes. The final transaction was stopped, but not before over \$75,000 was already lost.

"Take the time to talk with elderly friends and neighbors to make sure they understand the danger in responding to sweepstake offers. Keep in mind that the minute the telemarketer asks for an upfront fee to receive a sweepstakes winning, it is a scam," said Jackley.
