'By having to do some research before writing, youth are enlightened as to just how many times each day they experience some aspect of agriculture, even if they don't live on a farm," states Ann Price, executive director for SDAC.

"South Dakota dairy and hog farmers have been visiting classrooms as a part of SDFF's 'National Ag Week' activities for seven years now. The essay contest gives each school the opportunity to take part in the National Ag Week activities," adds Rebecca Christman, outreach director for SDFF.

Any third- or fourth-grade student in South Dakota can enter.

"Entire classrooms can submit essays. The more students from a single classroom who enter, the greater the chances that room will be having pizza for lunch one day," states Christman.

Price adds, "This contest was designed to meet the Common Core standards for writing, so teachers can use this as a practice activity before the DSTEP tests. Teachers can refer to the entry blank on the website to see what standards are being met.'


