



RTEC Drive Clears \$129,000 Level

Six new pledges received in the past week have pushed the Workforce Development Fund Drive above the \$129,000 level. The fund drive, launched several weeks ago by the Regional Technical Education Center (RTEC), has also received more than \$45,000 of in-kind pledges.

June live cattle fell 2.07 cents to \$1.3620 a pound; May feeder cattle was 2.37 cents lower at \$1.7620 a pound; while June lean hogs fell 1.45 cents to \$1.3080 a pound.

 • Clerks of court of South Dakota, particularly of those counties along state boundaries, forsee a considerable loss of revenue from marriage licenses as the result of a new marriage law passed by the last session of the legislature and which will go into effect on July 1, next. The requirement of the new law causing the most comment is that requiring a blood test of the contracting parties.
 • Yankton's eight champions were decided last night. Only three title-holders were forced to battle for their crowns as flu again played havoc with the entry list causing the non-appearance of several battlers thus handing the remaining champions their laurels unmolested.

 • The first outbreak of hog cholera to be reported in 1964 has been noted in Lincoln county. The outbreak involved a herd of 180 pigs, of which 35 had not been vaccinated against the disease. Eight pigs were dead and 12 sick among the non-vaccinated group.

Stocks rose Thursday after getting a boost from some encouraging news about the U.S. economy. An index of economic indicators rose in February by the largest amount in three months, suggesting growth will accelerate in the spring following a severe winter. The Philadelphia branch of the Fed said manufacturing rebounded in that region in March.
