Craig Smith, a second-year assistant at Nebraska, will be introduced today (Monday) at a 2 p.m. news conference in Vermillion, according to a USD release Sunday night.

Athletic director David Herbster and Smith, along with USD players, were unavailable for comment Sunday night.

Smith's name had been a popular candidate during the search process, as sources had told the *Press & Dakotan* he was a strong possibility from the start.

Smith, a native of Stephen, Minn., has coached alongside Tim Miles at three different schools, including their 2year tenure at Nebraska — Smith took over for Miles late in Friday's NCAA Tournament game after Miles was ejected.

A 1996 graduate of the University of North Dakota, Smith previously spent five seasons with Miles at Colorado State (2007-12). The guided the Rams to the NCAA Tournament in the 2011-12 season, and following the season Miles — later joined by Smith — left for Nebraska. Former Yankton High School standout Colton Iverson was a redshirt that season at CSU.

This season at Nebraska, Smith helped lead the Cornhuskers to the NCAA Tournament, where they lost last Friday in the second round to Baylor.

Smith has head coaching experience at the NAIA level, where he guided Mayville State (N.D.) to a 72-29 record in three seasons. Mayville State made three NAÏA National Tournaments and advanced to the championship game in 2007. He later spent time as the director of basketball operations under Miles at North Dakota State.

Smith will now take over a USD program that is coming off a 12-18 record this season under interim head coach Joey James. The Coyotes went 6-8 in the Summit League and lost in the first round of the tournament to

USD will lose two seniors, Trevor Gruis and Karim Rowson, but will return a solid core of five sophomores. USD will also open a new basketball arena for the 2016-17 season, which would be Smith's third at the helm.
