# State, Local Races Fill Up As Primary Deadline Passes

Tuesday was the filing deadline in South Dakota for candidates to enter party primaries in June for various statewide and local races. The last day to file nominating petitions for independent candidates is April 29. Here are the filings as of 3:45 p.m. Tuesday in area legislative races:

**DISTRICT 17** — Filing for the State Senate seat are Michelle Maloney (D) and Arthur Rusch (R), both of Vermillion.

The House seat has four candidates filed: Jamie Boomgarden (R) of Chancellor, Nancy Rasmussen (R) of Hurley, Ray Ring (D) of Vermillion and Marion Sorlien (D) of Viborg.

**DISTRICT 18** — Filing for the Senate seat are Democrat Bernie Hunhoff and Republicans Matt Stone and Thomas Bixler. All are of Yankton.

Four candidates have filed for the State House race: Jean Hunhoff (R), Mike Stevens (R), Jay Williams (D) and Terry Winter (D), all of Yankton.

**DISTRICT 19** — Bill Van Gerpen (R) of Tyndall is the lone person to have filed for the Senate seat.

Two candidates filed for the two House seats: Kyle Schoenfish (R) of Scotland and Kent Peterson (R) of Salem.

Neb. Drivers Reminded Of Violations

CENTER, Neb. — With spring here, the Knox County Sheriff's Office would like to remind all drivers that the passing of a school bus, with all safety lights flashing, is a violation of state statute and will be prosecuted.

The fine for passing a school bus with all safety lights flashing is \$500 plus court costs.

The Sheriff's Office would also like to remind parents that school permit holders are allowed to drive directly to and from school by the shortest route, and that they are allowed direct family only for passengers, not neighbors and friends. Because of the age of the drivers and their inexperience at driving, school permit violations are taken seriously and will be prosecuted.

CHICAGO (AP) — Grain futures were mostly lower Tuesday on the Chicago Board of Trade.

Wheat for May delivery fell 6.25 cents to \$7.0825 a bushel; May corn was 3.50 cents lower at 4.8650 a bushel; May oats declined 15.25 cents to \$4.0225 a bushel; while May soybeans were 2.50 cents higher at \$14.28 a bushel.

Beef was mixed and pork was lower on the Chicago Mercantile Exchange.

June live cattle was unchanged at \$1.3642 a pound; May feeder cattle was 53 cent higher at \$1.7810 a pound; while June lean hogs fell 3 cents to \$1.2520 a pound.

WALL ST. RECAP

Stocks got a lift Tuesday as health care companies bounced back after a heavy sell-off. Biotechnology stocks in the Standard & Poor's 500 index rose for the first time in five days after a sharp sell-off that prompted by concern over costs of the drugs they make.
