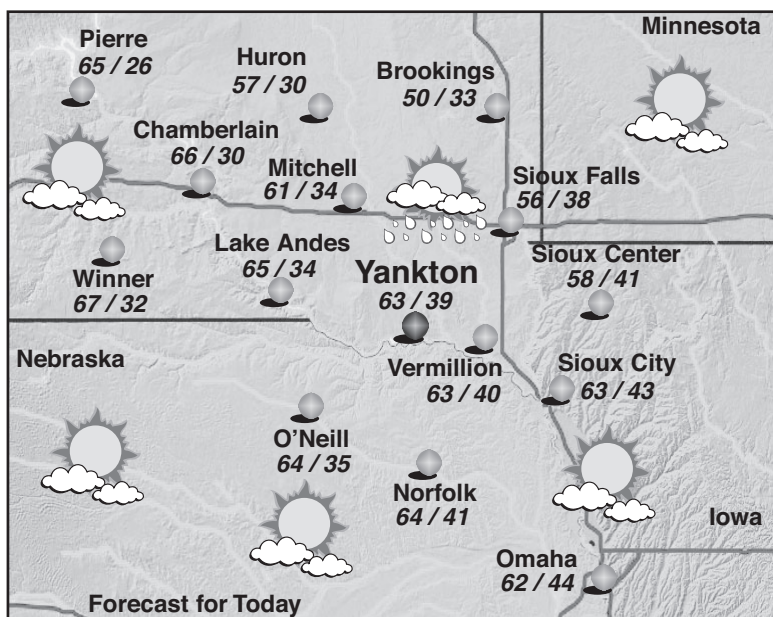

## Williams To Run For District 18 House

Jay Williams of Yankton has announced his candidacy for the District 18 House.

Co-chairman of the Yankton County Democratic Party, Williams is a native of South Dakota who grew up on a farm near Gettysburg, and as a Yankton businessman, U.S. Navy veteran, and former Peace Corps volunteer.

In a press release, he said he understands the wide range of issues that are important to the people of the state. He added that the single party South Dakota state government is not adequately serving the people of South Dakota.

"By rejecting the Medicaid expansion of the Affordable Care Act, the current Legislature has deprived South Dakotans of more than \$250 million in federal funds that should be shared with the people of South Dakota. In their myopic opposition to President Obama, the Republican Legislature has turned its back on the people they represent," said Williams.

Williams also supports raising the minimum wage in South Dakota.

As a school board member in Yankton, Williams said he has been frustrated by the lack of funding from the State. "Even with the current increase of more than 3 percent this year, the school funding levels are below the levels of five years ago. By under funding our children's education, the Republican legislature is hurting our most precious resource," he said.

Williams and his wife, Carol, are the parents of three grown children and have been part of the Yankton community since 1986.
