

**Germany Trusts Greece To Fulfill Bailout Terms**

BERLIN (AP) — Greece's finance minister said Sunday that he trusts Greece's current government to fulfill the conditions for the bailout deal, but also made clear the country would not receive any further money if it didn't.

Finance Minister Wolfgang Schauble told German newspaper Bild am Sonntag that "I trust them to implement the needed measures ... and to ultimately fulfill its obligations."

At the same time, Schauble warned that if Greece did not fulfill the demands laid out by the eurozone finance ministers in a four-month bailout plan, "there will be no more aid."

He also said it remains to be seen whether Greece needs more aid after the end of the current bailout plan, adding that "no matter what's going to happen, we will set very strict standards."

In a different interview Sunday afternoon with German public TV ARD, Schauble rejected the notion that Germany is at fault for the "problems from which the people in Greece have to suffer."

"Those who are at fault are those who were responsible for decades in Greece," Schauble said.

Germany's Parliament overwhelmingly approved the four-month extension of Greece's financial bailout on Friday, despite unease over the new government in Athens.

Last week, Greece won a four-month extension to its 240 billion-euro (\$270 billion) international loan agreement earlier this month in a deal with the other members of the 19-nation eurozone. In return, Athens has pledged a series of budget reforms, which for now contain no details but will have to be turned into concrete measures by April.

sponsor. He said local board members sometimes don't show up when decisions have to be made.

"You know what's happening on these county commissions? They go hide," Mickelson said.

He supported an amendment from House Democratic leader Spencer Hawley of Brookings that would make the majority-present threshold a local choice.

The House vote of 52-17 was more favorable than the debate's tone suggested.

The opponents came from a mixture of some Republicans, generally from the eastern third of South Dakota, and all of the House Democrats but Hawley.

Rep. Dennis Feickert, D-Aberdeen, asked Mickelson who brought the legislation to him.

"Now what I did, I recognized the issue," Mickelson answered. He said he spoke to leaders in various agricultural organizations and with state officials.

"I'll own this bill," Mickelson said. "I haven't heard from anyone who actually is a neighbor."

Feickert, a cattle pro-

ducer and former Brown County commissioner, urged the bill's defeat. "Please leave well enough alone," he said.

Rep. Tona Rozum, R-Mitchell, supports the changes. She said she's visited pork-raising facilities.

"They don't smell. I've been there," Rozum said.

"This is not the old pig in the mud story."

Mickelson gave his time for a closing rebuttal to one of the new legislators. Rep. Kent Peterson, R-Salem, told the story of life on his family's fifth-generation farm, where they operate a 2,000-head feedlot for cattle.

"We have more rules and regulations than anybody, and that's OK," he said.

Peterson said 1.2 million head of cattle are shipped from South Dakota every year to be finished in other states.

The Senate Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee scheduled HB 1201 as the only bill on its hearing calendar for Tuesday starting at 10 a.m. CST.

The other item of business is a confirmation hearing on the governor's reappointment of state Agriculture Secretary Lucas Lentsch, who supports Mickelson's bill on behalf of the Daugaard administration.

**Newspaper: Nurse Who Had Ebola Says Hospital Failed Her**

DALLAS (AP) — A 26-year-old nurse said in a newspaper interview that a hospital where she had worked in Dallas and its parent company failed her when she contracted Ebola while caring for the first person in the U.S. diagnosed with the deadly disease.

Nina Pham told *The Dallas Morning News* in the interview that she is preparing to file a lawsuit Monday in Dallas County against Texas Health Resources. She said she continues to suffer from body aches and insomnia after contracting the disease from a patient she cared for last fall at Texas Health Presbyterian Hospital Dallas.

Pham alleged the hospital's lack of training and proper equipment and violations of her privacy made her

"a symbol of corporate neglect — a casualty of a hospital system's failure to prepare for a known and impending medical crisis."

She also told the newspaper that Texas Health Resources was negligent because it failed to develop policies and train its staff for treating Ebola patients. She also told the paper that the company did not have proper protective gear for those who treated Thomas Eric Duncan, who died after becoming the first person in the U.S. diagnosed with the disease stemming from an outbreak in West Africa. Duncan, who contracted the disease on a visit to his native Liberia, died last fall only days before Pham tested positive for the disease.
