every three years. Scherschligt said the county has tentatively scheduled a public meeting to be held March 17 at the Yankton County Government Center to address residential concerns about the sirens and their locations.

He added that county officials have started solving some of the issues with visibility in revised plans.

Where these are located at, the trees are actually taller than the siren will be where they're at," Scherschligt said. "I'm not going to say you won't see it, but it won't be like a sore thumb sticking out in the middle of nowhere.

And while they may not be quite as visible, Scherschligt said they'll still be audible, with plans calling for the sirens to be heard at a level of 72 decibels at

2,500 meters. Scherschligt said the software the county is looking at for these sirens and others around the county is also intended to make sys-

tem maintenance easier. "Right now, we're getting so many sirens in the county that it's hard to put people at each one so every time we test them (we know) do they work or not,' he said. "This software communicates with them and tells us. 'Yeah. (the siren) rotated and the speaker works.' It could even go as far as we could put out a broadcast over (the system). We're not looking at doing that, but we could do that if we wanted to."

Commission chairman Todd Woods said the project is a priority for the board.

"Our lake area ... becomes one of the larger communities in the state in the summer," Woods said. "It's such a draw for tourism, and their safety, to me, is very important and I think it's a high priority."

He added that gaining

public input would help the

project going forward. "Anytime we get public input is a great thing," he said. "If you, as a citizen, have a question, please come to these meetings, educate yourself and get all the information. We want you to have the right information — not just what you hear as rumor or hearsay. These meetings will help get that information out there.'

More information on the public meetings will be announced at a later date.
