Electronic Bids for this project will be received by the South Dakota Department of Transportation (SDDOT) via the SDDOT secure bid submission site at <http://apps.sd.gov/hc65bidletting/bidsubmittallogin.aspx> until 10 A.M. Central time, on March 25, 2015, at which time the SDDOT will open bids. All bids will be checked for qualifications with results posted on the SDDOT website. The South Dakota Transportation Commission will consider all bids at a scheduled Commission meeting.

The work for which proposals are hereby requested is to be completed: **ON OR BEFORE NOVEMBER 23, 2016.**

The DBE goal for this project is: **MBE/DBE = 1%; WBE = 4%.**

Work Type for this project is: **Work Type 3.**

Bidders on this City Utilities Project will be required to comply with the: A) Federal Bid Requirements & Inclusions for Projects Involving Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program and B) D.E.N.R. State Revolving Funds (SRF) General Conditions. Goals for contract participation for DBE/MBE are 1% and WBE are 4%.

In addition to the above listed Federal requirement for work on this Sanitary Sewer Improvements Project, bidders will be required to comply with the Presidents Executive Order Nos. 11246, as amended, 11518 and 11625 as amended. cover “every inch” of the track, it’s not always the smartest route: There are some areas on some tracks where a car could hit a SAFER barrier and ricochet back into traffic, creating another dangerous scenario.

## Kansas Fires Women’s Hoops Coach Henrickson

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) — Kansas has fired women’s basketball coach Bonnie Henrickson after 11 seasons that included two trips to the Sweet 16 but not enough consistency to keep the program among the Big 12’s best.

Henrickson was relieved of her duties Monday, three days after losing to rival Kansas State in the opening round of the conference tournament. The Jayhawks finished the season 15-17.

Henrickson was hired away from Virginia Tech to rebuild a program. But the Jayhawks never finished better than sixth in the Big 12, and the Sweet 16 trips were their only NCAA tournament appearances.

Athletic director Sheahon Zenger said in a statement that assistant coach Katie O’Connor will serve as interim coach. A national search for a full-time replacement was already underway.

leged domestic assault against an ex-girlfriend and has missed three races.

There’s been no timetable given for his return, but after Delaware authorities last week declined to charge Busch, it would seem that his reinstatement could come as soon as this week. NASCAR has not detailed the steps Busch must take to return to competition.

One interesting aspect about the situation was raised on Sunday by Gene Haas, the Stewart-Haas Racing co-owner who hand-picked Busch to drive for the organization and pays for Busch’s car out of pocket. Haas seemed to indicate he wants Busch back in the No. 41, but also said he’s curious about the drivers’ eligibility in the Chase for the Sprint Cup championship.

The current rules say a driver must at minimum attempt to qualify, or race, in every event. A waiver can be granted by NASCAR in certain situations: Tony Stewart received one after missing three races last year following the fatal accident of a sprint car driver, and Brian Vickers received one after missing the first two races of this year after offseason heart surgery.

It’s not clear where NASCAR stands on the waiver for Busch. At a time when NASCAR is trying hard to be transparent, and trying hard to make rules very black and white, the issue of waivers pertaining to Chase eligibility should by crystal clear.

work as hard as you can to get position.”

The position the Jackrabbits (23-8) are in now is a championship showdown with the University of South Dakota on Monday at the Premier Center.

McIntyre, 6-foot-7 transfer from Florida, recorded the tournament’s first-ever triple-double with 20 points, 18 rebounds and 12 blocks.

And for the second time this season, a triple-double went for naught.

“Going out like that is awesome, but I’d rather go to the NCAA tournament,” McIntyre said.

Outside of their center who was 8-of-15 shooting, everyone else for the Golden Eagles were a combined 9-of-30.

“Going into the game, getting the ball out of her hands was huge for us,” SDSU sophomore Kerri Young said.

Turnovers and bench play were particular strengths for the Jackrabbits. They scored 19 points off 22 turnovers, and their reserves scored 14 points — ORU, in comparison, had two.

“Our defense was very disruptive, and that kept us in the game,” said senior Megan Waytashek, who had 13 points and seven rebounds.

“Even when our shots weren’t falling, we found a way to keep attacking.”

A Thompson three-pointer with 3:18 left gave SDSU a 49-42 lead. Macy Miller then followed that up with a layup and free throw, pushing the margin to 52-42.

Consecutive threes by the Jacks provided more than enough cushion to complete the comeback.

“We can be resilient, and we’ve been resilient at other times throughout the season,” head coach Aaron Johnston said.

And now, the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds will meet for the title.

“It’s fun to be in a tournament championship game, no matter who you’re playing,” Johnston said.

The veteran coach referenced the Coyotes and Jacks having the “benefit of playing each other.”

“It just makes the atmosphere and emotion and intensity that much higher,” he said.
