## Kansas Fires Women's Hoops Coach Henrickson

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) — Kansas has fired women's basketball coach Bonnie Henrickson after 11 seasons that included two trips to the Sweet 16 but not enough consistency to keep the program among the Big 12's best.

Henrickson was relieved of her duties Monday, three days after losing to rival Kansas State in the opening round of the conference tournament. The Jayhawks finished the season 15-17.
